SUBJECT: **Allocation of Performance-based Incentive Funds for Industry Certification Attainment from Specific Appropriation 115 from the 2022 General Appropriations Act (GAA)**

The Florida Department of Education (Department) has completed the allocation of the postsecondary performance-based incentive funds for industry certification attainment that are provided in Specific Appropriation 115 from the 2022 General Appropriations Act ([Chapter 2022-156, Laws of Florida](#)). The following statutory guidelines are specified for the distribution of these funds for performance-based incentives:

Funds in Specific Appropriation 115 shall be provided by the Department of Education to district workforce education programs for students who earned industry certifications during the 2021-2022 academic year. Funding shall be based on students who earned industry certifications with a school district postsecondary funding designation on the CAPE Industry Certification Funding List.

These performance funds shall not be awarded for certifications earned through continuing workforce education programs. School districts shall maintain documentation for student attainment of industry certifications that are eligible for performance funding. The Auditor General shall verify compliance with this requirement during scheduled operational audits of the school districts. If a district is unable to comply, the district shall refund the performance funding to the state.

The performance funding allocation is disbursed in two payments to the districts. The first payment is November 10, 2022 and the second payment is scheduled for April 2023. Section 1011.80 (6)(b), Florida Statutes, provides that “Each school district shall be provided \$1,000 for each industry certification earned by a workforce education student.” However, the total number of fundable certifications exceeded the appropriation amount. As a result, awards were pro-rated to an approximate value of \$821 per certification.

The attached document provides a summary of the performance-based incentive funds that will be disbursed to districts during the 2022-23 fiscal year. The report summarizes the total funded industry certifications and the allocation provided for each school district. Note the payment amounts for November and April in columns 3 and 4 of the table.

Your assigned district staff must retrieve this file within 7 business days after placement of the file. Upon receipt of this communication, please immediately take action to download this file.

Please review these student level reports to ensure that your district has correctly reported industry certifications that were eligible for funding. Summary reports are also available to districts. The Division of Career and Adult Education will provide a report to each district with information on the funded certifications by certification code and category, upon request of the district.
