

**Marjorie Turnbull**  
**Executive Director**  
**Tallahassee Community College Foundation**

Marjorie Turnbull has served as the Executive Director of the Tallahassee Community College Foundation since November of 1995. The Foundation is the private fund raising arm of the College and operates with a Board of leading citizens in the community.

Since Marjorie assumed the position of Executive Director, its assets have increased from \$250,000 to \$9 million, including over 70 endowed scholarships and more than 500 Challenge and Take Stock in Children Scholarships for middle school children who will be first generation college students. Under her leadership, the TCC Foundation will successfully complete its first Major Gifts Campaign totaling \$10 million.

From 1994-2000, Marjorie represented Leon County, District 9, in the Florida House of Representatives where she served on the Fiscal Responsibility Council, the Committees on Rules, Education Appropriations, Business Regulation and Consumer Services and Community Affairs. As a legislator she focused on the funding needs of education, benefits for public employees, the funding for the Challenger Learning Center, and the creation of a Florida World War II Memorial. Prior to her service in the House, she was a member of the Leon County Commission from 1988-1994, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Health Planning for the State of Florida, and a member of the staff of the Florida House of Representatives.

Marjorie is a member of the Board of Directors for the Foundation for Florida's Community Colleges, the statewide foundation for community colleges, and a past board member of the Florida Council for Resource Development. In addition to her professional activities, Marjorie is actively involved in community service in Leon County. She co-chaired a committee which developed a cultural plan for Tallahassee and Leon County. She currently serves as President of the Board for the Challenger Learning Center and has served in the past as President of the Council of Neighborhood Associations, the Tallahassee Symphony and the Children's Home Society. In addition, she serves or has served on the boards of numerous local advisory and civic groups, including the Girl Scouts, the Civic Center, the Florida Association of Voluntary Agencies for Caribbean Action, Seven Days of Opening Nights, the Legislative Historic Preservation Commission and the United Way. She is a member of the Rotary Club of Tallahassee and Zonta International.
