**Course Requirements**

Section 1003.4156, Florida Statutes (General requirements for middle grades promotion), is created to provide general requirements for promotion from middle school to high school. It provides that beginning with students entering grade 6 in the 2006-2007 school year, in order to be promoted to the 9<sup>th</sup> grade, students are required to complete:

Three (3) middle school or higher courses in English. These course shall emphasize literature, composition, and technical text.

### **Career and Education Planning Course**

As part of the requirement for middle grades promotion, each student should be enrolled in a career and education planning course in 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade. The course must include career exploration using CHOICES or a comparable cost effective program, education planning using the ePersonal Education Planner (ePEP) available online at [ww.FACTS.org](http://ww.FACTS.org), and shall result in the completion of a personalized career and education plan. This plan will allow each student to chart their courses for high school and major area of interest, set short and long term goals, record personal assessments such as interests, values, skills, and aptitudes, career options, and plan for postsecondary education.

The plan must be signed by the student, the student’s guidance counselor or academic advisor, and the student’s parent, and should become a portfolio of information that students can update as they continue their education and the career decision making process.

Districts will have four options for adding a career exploration and planning course.
