SUBJECT: Tallahassee Community College - Request Site Designation Approval for a Downtown Special Purpose Center in Tallahassee

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

To approve the request from the Board of Trustees of Tallahassee Community College for a Special Purpose Center site designation in the Mary Brogan Museum of Art and Science in downtown Tallahassee.

AUTHORITY FOR STATE BOARD ACTION

Section 1001.02 (7) (e), Florida Statutes.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Rule 6H-1.040 Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), entitled "Campus, Center, Special Purpose Center and Instructional Site Designations" provides that the State Board of Education (successor to the State Board of Community Colleges) review and recommend for or against the establishment of campuses, centers and special purpose centers. Based on the documentation presented by the college for the new site, all the criteria stipulated in Rule 6H-1.040 are satisfied. Currently, the Mary Brogan Museum is administered by the Leon County School Board. By mutual agreement, both boards passed resolutions to initiate the transfer of the property to Tallahassee Community College. The college is requesting this downtown service center to provide individuals working in the area with a convenient easily accessible location to satisfy their workforce educational needs. The targeted population is the private sector in the legal, management, accounting and association professions and the government sector of city, county, state and federal service.
