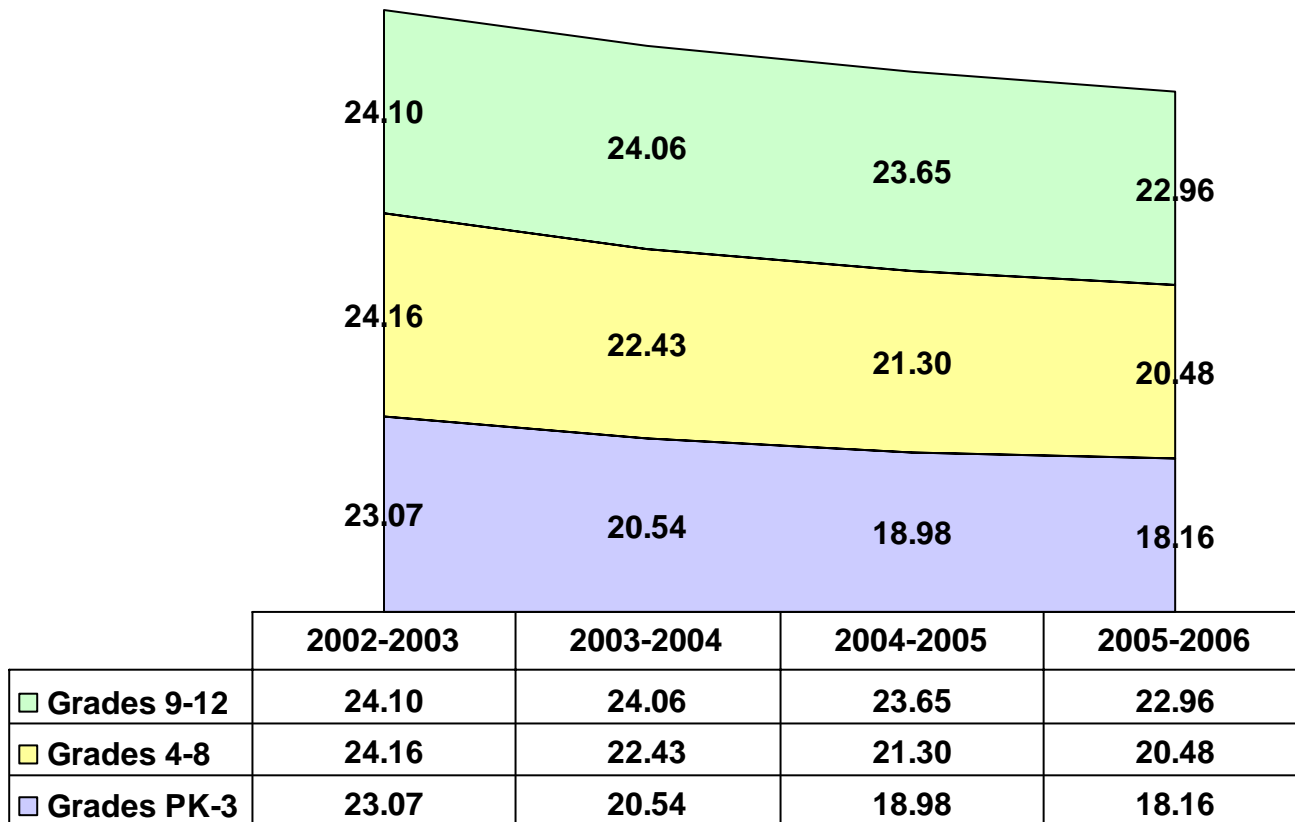

Trends in Class Size Reduction



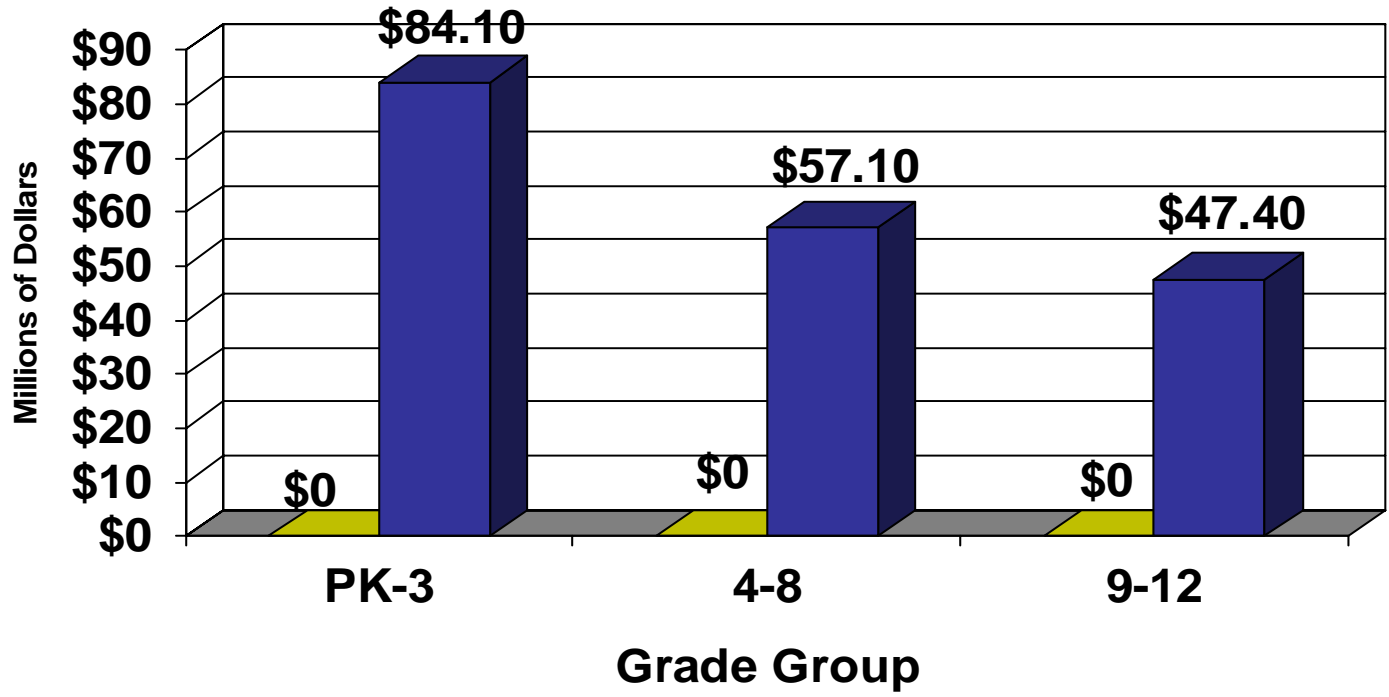

School-Level Average:	2006-07 through 2007-08
Classroom Level:	2008-09 through 2009-10
Fall 2010:	Constitutional Caps at Classroom Level

Accountability Measures

- **2005-06—Requires one of the following strategies for the following school year:**
 1. Year-round schools
 2. Double sessions
 3. Rezoning, or
 4. Maximizing use of instructional staff
- **2006-07—Requires State Constitutional Compliance Plan**
