<p>District Community Assessment Team – Miami-Dade County Public Schools will continue its implementation of the School-based Accountability Board created in 2005-2006. This committee, comprised of parents and community members, will continue its collaboration with district and staff personnel in the ongoing reform efforts of Miami-Edison Senior High School such as the implementation of the district's Secondary School Reform initiative that includes mentorship and internships for all 12th grade students, career and special themed academies, transition to the world of work courses, and career counseling personnel opportunities. The committee will continue reporting on a monthly basis to the state on the progress of the Corrective Action and School Improvement Plans. It will be expanded to include district staff as a member of the committee that will also serve as a liaison with the Florida Department of Education.
