HIGHLIGHTING SUCCESS:

The results of the 2007 FCAT Writing + indicate 74% of all students at Jefferson County High scored at or above 3.5. This is a 6 percentage point increase from the 2006 FCAT Writing results.

In Compliance:

School-wide Reform:

Jefferson has been awarded an Academic Summer Camp grant sponsored by the College Board. The camp is scheduled for 6/4/07.

Aligned Feeder Pattern Reform:

Jefferson Middle and Jefferson County High school staff members participated in a vertical team workshop 4/18/07, *Habits Needed for AP Mathematics Courses*.

Extended Learning with Transportation:

Jefferson High School currently has 13 students enrolled in the On-the-Job Training (OJT) program. The reports included the performance review of the students.

Community Assessment Team:

The Community Assessment Team met on April 30, 2007. The team discussed the increase in writing scores and the release timeline of FCAT retake scores for graduating seniors.

School-wide Staff Development:

- Four members of the Middle & High School faculty attended the FCIM conference by DOE.
- Twelve of the faculty attended the College Board Teaming workshop on 4/14/07.
- Two members of the faculty attended the FBLA Leadership Conference from 4/12/07-4/15/07.
- One school Resource Office attended the Florida Bullying Prevention Conference on 4/16/07-4/18/07.

Staff Development in Reading:

- Four members of the staff attended the Differentiated Instruction Training on 4/5/07.

Fully Staffed Entire School Year:

Jefferson County High School is fully staffed.

District On-site Reading Coaches:

Jefferson has a full-time Reading and Math Coach.

Extended Day Credit Recovery Program:

Ten students have received Extended Day Credit since the beginning of the semester and fifteen students have enrolled in Florida Virtual School.

Participation in State Approved SES:

The school reports outreach efforts for all eligible students to receive SES services. The District currently supports six students for SES.

Extended Learning with Transportation:

The after-school program ended 1/25/07. Jefferson County indicated that students are now being served during the school day.
