

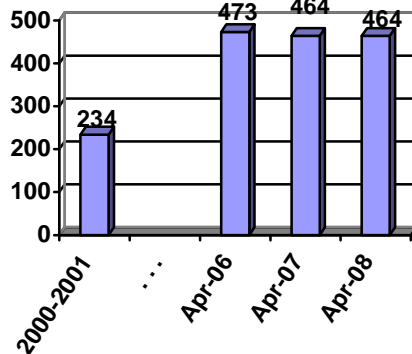
ACCESS TO THE BACCALAUREATE Partnerships Between Community Colleges and Universities Concurrent-use/Joint-use April 2008

Since 2000-2001, concurrent-use/joint-use partnerships between community colleges and four-year institutions have increased dramatically, demonstrating a growing interest in providing additional educational options to support the diverse needs of students.

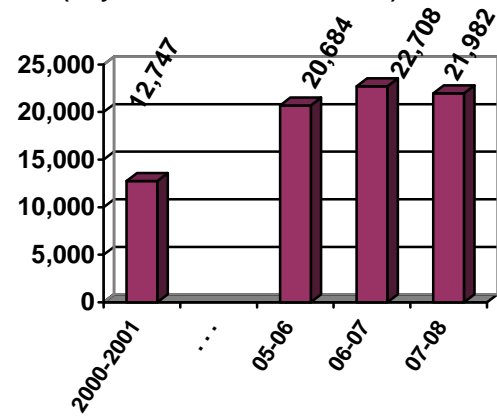
History

- In 1998-99, most students enrolled in Florida education partnerships were at six joint-use facilities in *Fort Walton, Lakeland, Daytona, Brevard, Davie, and Broward County*.
- These six facilities served a total of almost 16,000 students in 1998-99 in a very small number of programs. Since then, the program and enrollment numbers have grown significantly.

Highlights

- The percentage of programs reporting enrollment figures remains high.

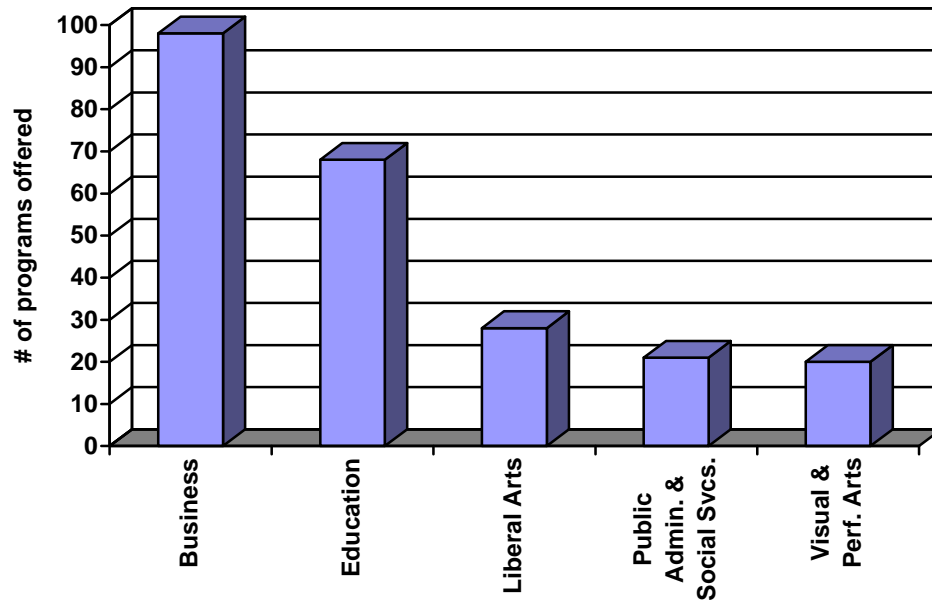
- ❑ **Twenty-six** of Florida's 28 community colleges currently offer upper-level courses through concurrent-use or joint-use partnerships. As a result, concurrent-use partnerships have provided access to 359 upper-level baccalaureate programs, 87 masters programs, 4 specialist programs, and 14 doctoral programs on community college campuses or shared facilities.
- ❑ **78% (362 out of 464 programs)** are offered completely on the community college campus.
- ❑ Between 2000-2001 and April 2008,
 - Although distance learning programs were omitted from this report for the first time in April 2008, the total number of concurrent-use/joint-use programs have **increased by 98%**.
 - The total self-reported enrollment in these programs **increased by 72%**.
- ❑ These partnerships were with
 - nine of eleven public state universities (82%),
 - ten Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF), and
 - two colleges/universities outside of Florida*.
- ❑ **69% (322 out of 464 programs)** of all concurrent-use partnerships were with Florida public institutions.
- ❑ **80% (18,207)** of students were enrolled in concurrent-use programs partnered with Florida public institutions.
- ❑ The Florida College System has an articulation agreement with the Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF). Currently, there are 25 ICUF member institutions participating in the agreement. In addition to the ICUF agreement, statewide articulation agreements exist between other nonpublic institutions and the Florida College System. These agreements are a collaboration between Florida's community colleges and the University of Phoenix, Keiser University, Strayer University and a recently approved agreement with the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities.

The baccalaureate programs were categorized by their two-digit Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) code. Out of the 359 baccalaureate programs, the top five groupings are:

1. Business (99 programs offered)
2. Education (69 programs offered)
3. Liberal Studies (28 programs offered)
4. Public Administration and Social Services (21 programs offered)
5. Visual and Performing Arts (20 programs offered)

* Decrease in the number of out-of-state institutions is due to the exclusion of distance learning programs.
