

### **History of the LIIS Minimum Standards Process**

In July 2010, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation awarded a grant to the Center for Educational Leadership and Technology (CELT) to assist the Florida Department of Education and local school districts in our work to establish minimum standards for Local Instructional Improvement Systems. Ohio was also being assisted in this project.

CELT began the project by holding three focus groups across the state (Ft. Lauderdale, Orlando, and Tallahassee). Staff from the districts were invited to participate in the focus groups. The purpose of the focus groups was to gather ideas on what comprised a Local Instructional Improvement System. During the focus groups, CELT capitalized on the opportunity to garner a list of volunteers from the districts who were interested in continuing to assist with the development of the minimum standards.

In August 2010, Florida was awarded the Race to the Top (RTTT) grant; establishing minimum standards for a Local Instructional Improvement System is one of the initiatives in Florida's application. This initiative was so closely aligned with the project with CELT that the efforts were combined. As described in Florida's RTTT application, a data implementation committee was established. The committee's Local Instructional Improvement System Minimum Standards Working Group is comprised of staff from school districts, schools, and educational consortia and is representative of Florida's diverse size and urbanicity. Committee members are listed in Table 1.

- (3) Assessment and Growth
- (4) Facilitator Profile
- (5) Learner Profile
- (6) Analysis and Reporting
- (7) Documentation and Support
- (8) Data Integration
- (9) IT Platform and Security

A series of webinars were held with each review team and the Local Instructional Improvement System Minimum Standards Working Group. The purpose of the webinars was to gather requirements for a Local Instructional Improvement System. On November 9-10, 2010, the Local Instructional Improvement System Minimum Standards Working Group met in Orlando with CELT and the Ohio counterpart to Florida's working group. The meeting provided an opportunity for Working Group members to meet in small groups to discuss each component and its requirements in more detail.

In December 2010, CELT provided the Florida Department of Education with the draft requirements for a Local Instructional Improvement System. The Florida Department of Education then developed guidelines for determining if a requirement should be considered minimum or optional. The Local Instructional Improvement System Minimum Standards Working Group members worked independently to recommend "minimum" or "optional" for each requirement. At the same time, the Florida Department of Education engaged internal experts to establish an initial recommendation for each requirement.

The Local Instructional Improvement System Working Group and Florida Department of Education recommendations were compiled and provided to legislative staff for feedback. Meetings were held with both internal staff and the Working Group to refine the requirements. On January 31, 2011, the minimum standards for a Local Instructional Improvement System were published by the Florida Department of Education.

### **Next Steps**

All RTTT participating districts in Florida will be required to implement a Local Instructional Improvement System that meets minimum standards by June 30, 2014.

Those standards deemed "optional" will be reviewed by the Working Group with the intent of publishing possible options for districts once they meet minimum standards.



### **Summarized Timeline**

### July 2010

- Florida, along with Ohio, partnered with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and CELT to establish minimum standards for a Local Instructional Improvement System
- > Focus groups held across the state to gather initial requirements and solicit volunteers

### August 2010

- Florida awarded RTTT
- CELT project and RTTT initiative were combined

### October 2010

- Local Instructional Improvement System Minimum Standards Working Group established
- Review Teams established
- Initial webinars with Working Group and Review Teams held to gather additional requirements

### November 2010

Working Group, CELT, and Ohio's team met in Orlando to discuss each component and its requirements in a small group setting

### December 2010

- Draft requirements provided by CELT
- Guidelines for recommending minimum vs. optional developed
- > Review of requirements for minimum vs. optional started

### January 2011

- Florida Department of Education established initial recommendations with assistance from internal experts
- Working Group established initial recommendations
- Combined recommendations presented to legislative staff for feedback
- Minimum standards published by the Florida Department of Education
