
Highlights of Grade 8 Reading

In 2007, 52 jurisdictions participated in the NAEP Grade 8 Reading assessment: 50 states, the Department of Defense Schools, and Washington, D.C.

- For the first time, Florida's Grade 8 students are on par with the national average scale score of 261.
- Florida's Grade 8 students improved four points in reading between 2005 and 2007—from 256 to 260.
- Florida was one of only six states whose NAEP Grade 8 reading average scale scores increased between 2005 and 2007.
- In 2007, Florida's Grade 8 students outperformed 35 percent of other states in reading, up from 19 percent in 2003.

Highlights

Florida's NAEP 2007 Grade 8 reading average scale score (260) was significantly higher than in 1998 (255) and 2005 (256).


For the first time since Florida's participation in NAEP, the 2007 Grade 8 reading average scale score was equal to the national average (260 vs. 261).

Florida's NAEP Grade 8 reading average scale score increased significantly between 1998 and 2007 (255 vs. 261), gaining 5 points, while the nation's average scale score stayed the same (261).

Florida was one of only six states with significantly higher Grade 8 reading average scale scores in 2007 than in 2005, and one of only six states with higher scale scores in 2007 than in 1998.

Highlights


A significantly higher percentage of Florida's Grade 8 students performed at or above *Basic* (71 percent) in 2007 than in 2005 (66 percent). The percentage scoring at or above *Proficient* increased 3 percentage points between 2005 and 2007 (25 percent vs. 28 percent).

Florida's improvement since 1998 is greater than the nation's:

- at or above Basic:
 - Florida 67 percent to 71 percent, a 4-percentage point increase
 - Nation 71 percent to 73 percent, a 2-percentage point increase
- at or above Proficient.
 - Florida 23 percent to 28 percent, a 5-percentage point increase
 - Nation 30 percent to 29 percent, a 1-percentage point decline

In 2007, Florida's NAEP Grade 8 reading average scale score (260) was

Illinois, Kentucky, Utah, Texas, Oklahoma, *Florida,* Michigan, Alaska, Georgia, Tennessee, North Carolina, Rhode Island, Arkansas, and South Carolina.*





In 2007, the percentage of Florida's Grade 8 students who scored at or above *Proficient* (28 percent) in reading was

• higher than eight states:

West Virginia, Nevada, California, Alabama, Hawaii, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Mississippi.*

not significantly different from the nation and 18 states:

Idaho, Delaware, Missouri, Indiana, Utah, Illinois, North Carolina, Texas, Kentucky, Michigan, *Florida,* Rhode Island, Alaska, Tennessee, Oklahoma, Georgia, Arkansas, South Carolina, and Arizona.*


lower than 23 states:

Highlights

The percentage of Florida's Grade 8 students scoring at FCAT Level 3 and above in reading increased 4 percentage points between 2002 and 2007 (45 percent vs. 49 percent).

The FCAT trend indicates slightly more improvement than the trend in Florida's NAEP Grade 8 reading results. The percentage of students at or above *Basic* from 2002 to 2007 has remained constant (72 percent to 71 percent) as has the percentage of students at or above *Proficient* (29 percent to 28 percent).
