## **McKay Scholarship Program**

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program allows parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. This program provides eligible students the opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer to another public school. Eligible students include students who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6 months. Students must also have been enrolled and reported for funding by a Florida school district the year prior to applying for a scholarship.

### Voicing Their Choice


Over the past decade, thousands of parents have chosen the McKay Scholarship Program. During the 2020-21 school year, \$211.8 million was paid to scholarship program participants. The scholarship amount for IEP students enrolled ranged from \$549 to \$25,088 averaging \$8,618. The average amount for students with a 504 Plan was \$4,725.

### McKay Student Diversity



Over the last five years, student participation in the McKay Scholarship Program has seen a slight decrease. In 2020-21, 28,065 students from 1,565 private schools participated in the program. Private schools participating in McKay must document compliance with eligibility requirements specified in law. HB 7045 repeals the McKay Scholarship Program effective July 1, 2022, transitioning students from McKay to FES-UA (Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Disabilities).


### Student Participation in McKay Scholarship Program

Florida. Eligible students may attend a different public school in their own district, or a public school in a neighboring district if space is available.
