ELIGIBILITY:

- Entries will be categorized and judged according to the school level (high school and postsecondary).
- **Only one student's essay PER CHAPTER will be considered.** Each chapter must select one essay to represent them. If multiple essays are received, they will be disqualified.
- Students entering the essay competition are expected to register for and be present at the conference.
- Students are expected to bring printed copies of their essays with them to the conference. First place winners should be prepared to read their essays at the Sunday awards ceremony.

GUIDELINES:

- Entries must be at least two pages and must not exceed three pages in length.
- Essay must be typed, double spaced, with 1 inch margins using a font no smaller than 12 point.
- Member name, chapter name and grade level must be identified on a cover page attached to the essay.
- If sources are used for the essay, they must be identified on a "Works Cited" page.
- Essay must be on the topic specified above.

SCORING:

- The essay will be scored using the attached rubric. The points from each category will be totaled in order to determine a winner. The maximum total number of points possible is 100.
- The first, second and third place winners will be announced during the closing session on Sunday.
