Student Lesson Plan Competition

ELIGIBILITY:

- Entries will be categorized according to the school level (high school and postsecondary).
- Only one student's lesson plan PER CHAPTER will be considered. Each chapter must select one student's lesson plan to represent it. If multiple lesson plans are received, those students will be disqualified.
- Students entering the lesson plan competition are expected to register for and be present at the conference.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. The original lesson plan may be written for one of the following grade levels:
 - Pre-Kindergarten
 - Elementary School
 - o Primary (K-3)
 - o Intermediate (4-5)
 - Middle School (grades 6-8)
 - High School (grades 9-12)
- 2. The original lesson plan may be written for any of the following subjects or a combination of two or more subject areas:
 - English/Language Arts
 - Fine Arts
 - Performing Arts
 - Health
 - Mathematics
 - Physical Education
 - Science
 - Social Studies
- 3. The lesson plan must be typed and should follow the format on the attached page. All lesson plans should address the Florida Standards found at www.CPALMS.org.
- 4. In addition to the lesson plan, the student should provide additional demonstration of the lesson, including but not limited to video of the lesson being presented to students or examples of student work.

SCORING:

- The lesson plan will be scored using the attached rubric. The points from each category will be totaled in order to determine a winner. The maximum total number of points possible is 100.
- The first, second and third place winners will be announced during the closing session on Sunday.
