• Methods for integrating individual assessments supporting comprehensive initiatives, and driving positive skill development leading to high wage, high growth careers

Focus on Diversity and Under-Representation

- Tools, tips, and best practices for outreach and advising under-represented participants
- Promising practices for increasing diversity through program design and case management
- Leading vision and strategy for influencing community cultures related to diversity and inclusion
- Building career service models that work in a diverse community

Focus on Relationship between Assessments, Training, and Career Development

- Applying new recruitment strategies that work
- Receiving annual training in assessments such as CASAS, TABE, and the new Adult Education Career Information System
- Effective models for integrating, assessing, or improving professional experiences in FCDP programs
- Approaches to collaboration with career service professionals and agencies to increase professional impacts of career development
