APPRENTICESHIP

This presentation pertains only to those Apprenticeship Sponsors who have entered into an agreement with a Local Educational Agency, school district or community college.

Postsecondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) Curriculum Framework

- Defines purpose of training program
- Overview of content
- Intended students outcomes, what the student should be able to do
- Provides program reporting numbers
- Occupational Completion Points within the program
 - OCP the point that a student may leave a program and become employed in an occupation

Registered Apprenticeship Curriculum Framework

- Generic one framework for all programs
- Special notes:
 - Federal definition of an apprenticeship program
 - Conditions for reporting requires an agreement between LEA and sponsor
 - Sponsor and apprentice must have a RAIS number

Registered Apprenticeship Curriculum Framework

- Major Concepts/Content: The purpose is to provide training in various trade areas. The content of the programs will vary as directed by the local apprenticeship sponsors in each trade area.
 - Relates back to program standards approved by Apprenticeship Office

Registered Apprenticeship Program Reporting Numbers

- Process of transitioning to new Apprenticeship program specific numbers
- New program numbers now immediately identifies the program as an apprenticeship program and students as apprentices
- OCPs are based on 2000 hours per year and movement from one level to the next level, designated by the sponsor

Registered Apprenticeship Program Reporting Numbers

 Matrix provides reporting number for Community Colleges and School Districts

Flexibility in program length – 2-5 years

Identifies occupation

Registered Apprenticeship Student Enrollment & Reporting

- Apprentices in school districts and community colleges are enrolled in a program/course/section
- Basis for reporting student performances
 - Program completers and placement on a job
- Reports of student performances sent to DOE at specific times throughout the year

Registered Apprenticeship Program Funding

- Legislature appropriates dollars for Workforce Education in Community Colleges and School Districts
 - PSAV, College Credit, AS, AAS, Adult Ed
 - Apprenticeship programs at LEAs are funded out of the Workforce Budget

Registered Apprenticeship Program Funding @ Community Colleges

- Workforce dollars are combined with all CC state funding dollars
- Lump sum dollars are distributed to CC based on a formula agreed upon by CC Presidents
- The local CC administration allocates the dollars to the individual programs

Registered Apprenticeship Program Funding @ School Districts

- Workforce dollars are kept as a separate allocation
- Dollars are sent to the districts based on previous year's budget
- New money distributed based on enrollment and performances
- Local school district administrators allocate the dollars to individual schools and programs

Registered Apprenticeship Program Funding

- Moving towards a new reporting and funding system that will provide information relative to the state funds generated by individual programs
- There are no Federal or State dollars allocated for Apprenticeship programs
