<b>Validation Mechanism:</b>				
To be eligible for articulation, the student must show evidence of their current <u>Emergency Medical Technician - Basic (EMT)</u> certification and it must have been issued within three (3) years prior to their enrollment in the program.

The <u>Emergency Medical Technician - Basic (EMT)</u> certification represents industry acknowledgement of technical skill attainment of competencies in the <u>Emergency Medical Services</u> program.

Florida College System institution administrators, program deans and faculty were consulted and agreed that the " <u>Emergency Medical Technician – Basic (EMT)</u> " certification shall articulate <u>nine (9)</u> college credit hours the AAS/AS Degree in <u>Emergency Medical Services</u> .
