<p>Ongoing School Activities</p>	<p>Reading Challenge: 1-5: The class with the most AR points for the grade level will win a cookie party. K: Each student will be provided a reading log to log the number of books read at home during the week. Each class whose students read at least three books each will win a prize. (i.e. If there are 18 students in the class, the class total will be 54. If the class has 10 students, the total will be 30.)</p> <p>Bookmark contest: Students will be provided with a bookmark blank to design according to the theme. K-2 and 3-5 each will have a 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winner who will receive prizes. The winning bookmarks will be duplicated and used in the library as well as displayed on a library poster.</p> <p>Book Poster contest: Students will each design a poster advertising their favorite book. (8 ½ x 11) The classroom teacher will pick a winning poster to be submitted to the library for consideration to be made into a book trailer commercial.</p> <p>Mystery Reader of the Day: An unidentified staff member will read a short book on the news and classes will have to guess who it is. Guesses need to be submitted to the library by 10:30 AM daily in order to be placed in a drawing for a class party.</p> <p>Door Decorating contest: (optional) Teachers decorate their classroom door as a book. The winning teacher will receive lunch delivered from a local restaurant.</p> <p>DEAR: Classes will read for at least 10 minutes a day.</p>
<p>Monday, January 28</p>	<p>RED shirt day: Wear a red shirt. <u>Read Every Day</u> Survey Monkey: What is your favorite book turned into a movie?</p>
<p>Tuesday, January 29</p>	<p>Knock Your Socks Off With Reading: Crazy Sock Day Hats Off to Reading: Donate \$1 for literacy activities and wear your favorite hat to school. Buddy Reading: (Optional) Classes will pair up for buddy reading with other classes during morning MTSS time to promote fluency and comprehension.</p>
<p>Wednesday, January 30</p>	<p>Wednesday Wise Owls: Wacky glasses day. (Templates will be provided) Story Starters: K-1 and ESE: Classes will submit a class story. The teacher will provide the first line, and each student will then add a line to the story until its completion. There will be a class prize for the winning story. 2-5: Groups of students will each have their own unique story prompt and be timed as they complete their story. The teacher will choose the best story for the class and submit it to the library. The group with the winning story will earn a prize. Grade levels will create grade appropriate starters.</p>
<p>Thursday, January 31</p>	<p>Bedtime stories: Students will be able to wear their pajamas to school and Llama, Llama, Red Pajama will be read on the morning news. HCPL children’s librarian will visit for story time. Library Literacy Night: Bedtime stories will be carried over to the nighttime event. There will be cookies and cocoa, as well as read alouds and other activities.</p>

Friday, February 1	Dress as your favorite book character: Students and teachers will dress as their favorite book character. They must be able to name the book. (Not an opportunity to recycle just any costume.) All students who participate will have their name placed in a drawing for a prize. They will receive an extra entry if they have the book with them. Teachers who participate will have their names in a separate drawing for a special prize.

3. Most Improved Reader: SCHOOL WIDE

The Literacy Leadership Team is asking all teachers to nominate one student from their class. All nominated students will be recognized at the literacy rally and one winner will be chosen from each of the following categories: K-2, 3-5, 6-8.

4. Mystery Reader:

Each morning a mystery reader will read a short passage from a book or a poem after the morning announcements. Teachers are encouraged to have students vote on who they think the mystery reader is. The mystery reader's name will be announced at the end of the day.

5. Slumber Stories:

2nd Annual Slumber Stories evening event: Thursday January 3rd Parents, staff members, community members, and friends will be invited into classrooms to read to students for an evening event.
