

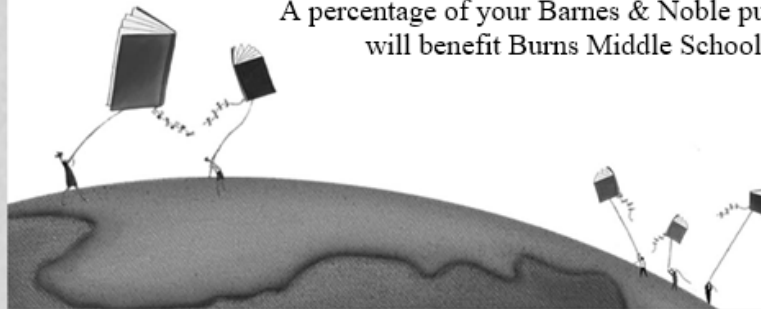

**Monday** – Every teacher chooses a book to read aloud for the first 10 mins of each class period (except lunch).

**Tuesday** – Literacy Escape Room – teachers will sign up with Mrs. Griner (see the email that is forthcoming).

**Wednesday** – Janice Harris, a self-published local author, which also works for HCPS, will visit with our students. Teachers will sign up with Griner (see the email that is forthcoming).

**Thursday** – Throughout the day, students will be randomly asked if they have a poem in their pocket. If they do, they can read it aloud or have the faculty/staff member read it for a small prize. There will also be a Poetry Scavenger Hunt in the Media Center during all 3 lunches.

**Friday** – Biographies for Breakfast in the Media Center. Students will read a biography of the person of their choice and fill out a Biographies for Breakfast report about their reading. They will enjoy breakfast with a faculty/staff member and discuss their biography.

**Instagram Give-A-Way** – students will need to follow Greco Media Center's Instagram page for the rules to win books written by Rick Riordan. He is the #1 New York Times bestselling author of over twenty novels for young readers, including the Percy Jackson series, the Kane Chronicles, the Magnus Chase series and the Trials of Apollo.

**Your Teacher's Favorite Book Contest** – A contest for students to figure out their teacher's favorite childhood books. Students will have to match the teacher's name with their favorite childhood book and teachers will write about why the book is their favorite. This is a fun way to get students talking to our teachers about reading and the books we love. Parents:**

1. Model good reading habits by reading to or alongside your child; parents set the stage for children to become better readers.
2. Encourage your child to read new and challenging books, articles and magazines.
3. Establish a daily reading routine.
4. Encourage reading, writing and discussions among family members.
5. Be positive when talking with your child about their reading ability and skills.
6. The love of reading begins at home. Create a "home library" for your family to access.
7. Limit TV viewing by controlling the amount of time spent watching television.
8. Play word games with your child.
9. Expose children to different kinds of books such as novels, biographies and informational content. Books about our universe or various species are interesting and engaging for young learners.
10. Visit your local public library and help your child get a library card of their very own.
11. Take books in the car to read, rather than watching a DVD.
12. Create a "reading nook" in your home where your child can read.
13. Comment on new words your child hears on the radio or TV.
14. Play rhyming games during a car trip or at home. Children will enjoy learning their own version of rhymes you learned as a child as well as how spelling effects rhyming.
15. Read the back of the cereal box at breakfast.
16. Select a "word of the day" to add to your child's ever growing vocabulary.

17. Write out words with opposite meanings on separate pieces of paper and have your child match the pairs together (i.e. huge-tiny).
18. Make up a story by having each family member add a sentence to a story starter; expand on the individual character traits, the setting of the story and exciting events/adventures.
19. Set aside additional reading time or add extra bedtime story time as a reward for good behavior.
20. Encourage your child to write a book about their day.
21. Help your child read the labels on different bottles and containers, including the shampoo and conditioner bottles at bath time.

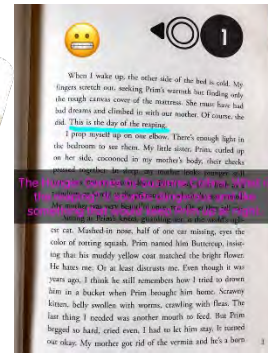
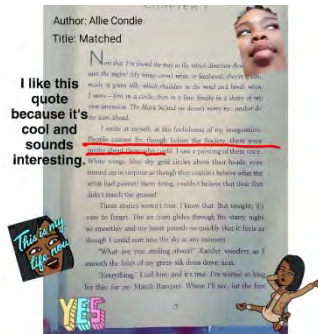
