<p>Monday, January 28</p>	<p>Media Center – “Spreading the view” of the world through literacy Reading Coach – Read to PK, K and ESE “spreading her view of literacy” - Assistant Principal and Resource Officer – “Spread their view of literacy” on morning announcements. Classroom Teachers – Decorate classroom door as a book cover. - Choose a literacy theme for the week. - Spread their view of literacy” and the importance with their class. Students – Twenty minutes of enjoyable reading in the classroom for their “view” of fun reading. Teachers take pictures and post to be “viewed”. Chart the number of minutes read.</p>
<p>Tuesday, January 29</p>	<p>Media Center – “Spreading the view” of the world through literacy Reading Coach – Read to grades 1 and 2, “spreading her view of literacy” - Principal and PE Teacher – “Spread their view of literacy” on morning announcements. Classroom Teachers – Read to their homeroom students so the students can “view” them reading and “make mind movies”. Teachers will let the reading coach know when they are reading so pictures can be taken for all to “view”. Students – Write a recommendation for a book that needs to be read and “viewed” by other students. PK may draw a picture.</p>
<p>Wednesday, January 30</p>	<p>Media Center – “Spreading the view” of the world through literacy Reading Coach – Read to grade 3, “spreading her view of literacy” - District School Superintendent and Director of Safety and Mental Health – “Spread their view of literacy” on morning announcements. Classroom Teachers – Have students be creative and share their “view” of creative book markers for all, and especially themselves as they “view” their books. Students – Will write on a sticky note their “view” as to why reading is important and place the sticky notes on a bulletin board in the cafeteria for all to “view”</p>

<p>Thursday, January 31</p>	<p>Media Center – “Spreading the view” of the world through literacy Reading Coach – Read to grade 4, “spreading her view of literacy” - Director of Teaching and Learning Services and PE Coach – “Spread their view of literacy” on morning announcements. Classroom Teachers – Invite a guest reader into your classroom to read. The reader can be an administrator, community member, community leader, elected official, high school student, retired teacher, school board member, etc... it is teacher choice. Students – Forty minutes of enjoyable reading with point of “view” discussed. Students will read for several minutes and discuss the texts being read. This can be whole group, small group, or partners - basically Literature Circles. Minutes should be charted.</p>
<p>Friday, February 1</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">100th Day of School</p> <p>Media Center – “Spreading the view” of the world through literacy Reading Coach – Read to grade 5, “spreading her view of literacy” - School Counselor and PE Coach – “Spread their view of literacy” on morning announcements. Classroom Teachers – Tally reading minutes with students and read enough minutes to reach the next 100s place. For example if the class has read 1817 minutes, then as a class they will read an additional 83 minutes, collectively, to reach 1900 minutes. Students – Carry a poem in their pocket, form their “view”, it may be their favorite poem or a poem they wrote. They will read the poem to other students and teachers. After reading the poem to someone the student will get the listener to initial in the margins of the poem. Resource teachers, administrators, paraprofessionals, and office staff will listen during the day as the students read as well. Reading on the front field – <i>Everyone is to bring a towel, mat, or blanket and join on the front field of the school for 30 minutes of reading. Everyone will be “viewed” reading as the traffic passes on Hwy 27. We will have pictures from different “views” of the students reading, including a drone.</i></p>
<p>Prior to Monday, January 28</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Office doors, Cafeteria doors, Media Center Doors, Special Area Doors, etc... will be wrapped as a book cover - Vintage Book Display in the Display Case in the Main Office
<p>Week Long Activities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Book Projects - Students will create a book project at home and it will be display at school with the book they read. This can be a poster, an item, diorama, etc... This will remain on display through PRIDE Night at school. - Parents – email to the Reading Coach or place on PTO Facebook page pictures of them reading with their children at home, park, or somewhere other than school. - Teachers – Email to the Reading Coach or post on the PTO Facebook page pictures of themselves reading somewhere other than school. - Play – “Name That Book” at lunch. Reading Coach will read quotes, characters, settings, etc... from different books.
