



Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida!

Monday,
January 24th

Bronson Middle High School (6-12)- All Week- Student Government representatives will be reading aloud books to their peers in the separate classroom; Word of the Day- Words tied to the theme will be included and defined on the morning announcements each day; Book Checkout Drive- Students will be encouraged to check out books all week and given an incentive for doing so; Favorite Book One-Pager- ELA teachers will have students use a one-pager poster template to represent their favorite book. At the end of the week, those who submit their designs will be rewarded.

Bronson Elementary School (Pre-K-5)- Launch Literacy Week 2022 with a morning announcement and reading of the oath. Talk to students about setting and that changing where a story takes place, changes many details in the story. Explain that this week we are going to read several versions of a familiar fairytale. Classes will compare and contrast the versions and on Thursday, students will write their own version of the fairytale using their own unique setting. (ex. The 3 Little Pigs, Cinderella)

Cedar Key School (Pre-K-12)- All Week- Theme for the Week- “There’s No Place Like Homecoming to Launch Into Literacy Week” at Cedar Key School! Monday- Dress Up Day-“Which Witch is Which?” Literacy Activity- Drop everything and read a piece of the Wizard of Oz with your twin or teacher!

Williston Middle High School (6-12)- All week- Words of the Week Scavenger Hunt – Daily words will be hidden around campus for students to find. Monday- Who’s who? Teacher pictures posted with their favorite book and students will guess who the teacher is.

Also, the story's tone and theme rely on its setting. In addition, the setting shapes the characters.
