Collaborative Curriculum Challenge Grant Recipients

This year's recipients are Brevard, Miami-Dade and Osceola counties. Brevard's grant is titled "Grow Your Grit in Accelerated Programs." Its goal is to train teachers and guidance counselors in the nature and needs of gifted students as well as continue to focus on a growth mindset, while introducing grit, perseverance and long term goal planning. There hope is to increase gifted student participation in accelerated coursework. Miami-Dade will be collaborating with Miami-Dade College and Prepworks. "The Opportunity Changes Everything" goals will focus on improving dual enrollment students' achievement in evidence-based reading and writing and mathematics, increasing the

number of scholarship winners and increasing the number of gifted students earning an Associate Degree through advanced placement and dual enrollment, Osceola will collaborate with the University of Central Florida in a joint endeavor named "Affective Development for Academic Success." It is aimed at a curriculum redesign in grades 9-12 to meet the social and emotional needs and promote academic growth. This project hopes to nurture socioemotional development to impact cognitive growth and provide students a pathway to meet their academic potential.
