<p>NOTE: A student is involved in a hate crime if they cause physical injury, emotional suffering or property damage through intimidation, harassment, racial/ethnic slurs and bigoted epithets, vandalism, force or the threat of force, motivated all or in part by hostility to the victim's real or perceived race, religion, color, sexual orientation, ethnicity, ancestry, national origin, political beliefs, marital status, age, social and family background, linguistic preference or disability. The person was involved in creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment. The motivation (intent) behind the act is the key element in determining whether an incident is hate-related₂.</p> <p>→ ₁Mental or Physical Disability means that the victim suffers from a condition of physical or mental incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain damage, or mental illness, and has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict the victim's ability to perform the normal activities of daily living (Section 775.085, F.S.).</p> <p>→ ₂Florida Department of Law Enforcement's <i>Hate Crime Report Manual, Annual Report/Hate Crimes in Florida/January 1 – December 31, 2003, definition of hate crimes.</i></p>

General Rule: If a decision must be made, the incident that caused the most injury or the highest loss of property or monetary cost should be reported.

→ *Incidents that must be reported to SESIR and ARE EXPECTED to be reported to law enforcement. An incident should be coded as Reported to Law Enforcement if an official action was taken by a School Resource Officer (SRO) or local Law Enforcement Officer such as: a case number was assigned, a report was filed, an affidavit was filed, an investigation was conducted and found to be an incident reportable to SESIR OR an arrest was made. The presence of, or consultation with, a law enforcement officer or SRO is not sufficient for an incident to be coded as **“Reported to Law Enforcement.”**

**Incidents that must be reported to SESIR, but MAY NOT NEED to be reported to law enforcement.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC – STATE VALIDATION

- 58. If Survey Period Code is 1 or 5 and if Graduation Option code = 7, then Exceptionality, Primary on the Exceptional Student record must be C, F-K, M, O-P, S, V, or W. Exceptionality, Primary may also be L if Exceptionality, Other is C, F-K, M, O-P, S, V, or W. If Survey Period Code is 2, 3 or 4 and if there is a matching Student Course Schedule record and if Graduation Option code = 7, then Exceptionality, Primary on the Exceptional Student record must be C, F-K, M, O-P, S, V, or W. Exceptionality, Primary may also be L if Exceptionality, Other is C, F-K, M, O-P, S, V, or W. The match should use District Number, Current Enrollment; Student Number Identifier, Florida; Year/Fiscal Year and Survey Period Code. - state validation-

EXAMPLE

The third Student Demographic record listed below would cause a message to be generated because the correct relationship does not exist between Graduation Option and Exceptionality, Primary. The fourth Student Demographic record listed below would cause a message to be generated because the correct relationship does not exist between Graduation Option; Exceptionality, Primary; and Exceptionality, Other.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC – STATE VALIDATION

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

The district must correct the Student Demographic or Exceptional Student records so that the appropriate relationship exists between Graduation Option; Exceptionality, Primary; and Exceptionality, Other.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE/REFERRAL ACTION - STATE VALIDATION RULES

- 31. For surveys 2 and 3, each Student Discipline/Referral Action record must have a matching Student Demographic record based on District Number, Current Enrollment; Student Number Identifier, Florida; Survey Period Code and School Year unless School Number/Current Enrollment is N998 or N999. For survey 5, each Student Discipline/Referral Action record must have a matching Student Demographic and Student End of Year Status record based on District Number, Current Enrollment; Student Number Identifier, Florida; Survey Period Code and School Year unless School Number/Current Enrollment is N998 or N999. -state validation 3-

EXAMPLE

The first two records below would not pass this edit because they do not have matching Student Demographic records. The third record below would pass this edit because there is a matching Student Demographic Information record.

The district must delete the Student Discipline/Referral Action records or add matching Student Demographic Information records .

SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY INCIDENT REPORT - REJECT RULES

- 40. Deleted 7/16/08. ~~If Incident, Type code is DRD, then Incident, Drug-Related code must be Y. --record rejected--~~

SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY INCIDENT REPORT - REJECT RULES

- 41. Deleted 7/16/08. If Incident, Type code is equal to ALC, then Incident, Alcohol-Related code must be Y. -record rejected-

EXAMPLE

The first two records listed below would be loaded to the data base assuming no other reject rule would cause their rejection. The third record would be rejected because the Incident, Type is ALC and Incident, Alcohol-Related is not coded Y.

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

If the rejected record should not have been submitted, no action is required. However, if the district wishes the data in the rejected record to be loaded to the data base, the district must correct the relationship between Incident, Type and Incident, Alcohol-Related and resubmit the record.

TEACHER COURSE - EXCEPTION REPORTS

- 65. If Survey Period Code equals 2 or 3, for each Teacher Course record with a Scheduling Method equal to C, M or A there must exist at least one other Teacher Course record with the same Scheduling Method (at least 2 C's, 2 M's or 2 A's) based on District Number, Current Instruction/Service; School Number, Current Instruction/Service; Period Number; Classroom Identification/FISH Number; Survey Period Code and Fiscal Year. -exception report-

The first and second Teacher Course records listed below would pass this edit. The third record listed below would not pass this edit because another Teacher Course record based on the indicated fields of the edit does not exist.

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

The district must verify whether the Teacher Course record is valid, and, if so, whether a matching Teacher Course record is needed based on District Number, Current Instruction/Service; School Number, Current Instruction/Service; Period Number; Classroom Identification/FISH Number, Survey Period Code and Fiscal Year.
