Why Play with Language When Writing?

In Ralph Fletcher's new book *Pyrotechnics on the Page: Playful Craft That Sparks Writing* (2010), Fletcher suggests that writers make language choices and sentence structure choices to reinforce the ideas being expressed.

What are some reasons for using form to reinforce content?

- To emphasize a certain part of the text
- To highlight the idea
- To create the unexpected
- To add humor or surprise
- To slow down the pace
- To quicken the pace
- Just for fun and the love of word play
