Greetings Presidents & Superintendents,

Recently, the Department of Education [announced](#) a \$1 million dollar grant opportunity for expanding entrepreneurship education and training (EET) within our state's career and technical education (CTE) programs. It also announced a series of engaging webinars (see [here](#)), aimed at helping faculty, staff, and community and economic development partners understand the importance of entrepreneurship education for 21st century learning. I want to invite you to apply and attend.

We know the increased demand for higher order knowledge and skills, but we also know that technically skilled talent is *not* all that matters. The rise in demand of human skills, like mental agility, flexibility, strong analytical and critical thinking,
