Preparing to Set Standards for the U.S. History EOC Assessment

A committee of educators from across Florida will meet this August to review the U.S. History EOC Assessment and the U.S. History Achievement Level Descriptions, and based on its review, propose cut scores for this assessment. This process is called standard setting. In preparation for this meeting, the draft U.S. History Achievement Level Descriptions were posted for 30 days of public review beginning in mid-March.
