


Data Snapshot

Eight in 10 high school seniors taking a dual enrollment course entered college the year after high school graduation

Eighty-one percent of 12th graders who participated in dual enrollment in 2010-11 enrolled at a Florida college or university in 2011-12. Comparatively, 45 percent of students who did not take dual enrollment courses directly transitioned into a Florida college or university in 2011-12.

Most prior year dual enrollment students went on to enroll at either a Florida College System (FCS) (43.7%) or a State University System (40.1%) (SUS) institution. This figure includes a small number of high school graduates who enrolled at



both FCS and SUS institutions in the year after completing high school.

Non-dual enrollment students were about three times more likely to enroll at an FCS institution than a public university the year after high school graduation.
