	Immigrant Adult. Adult refugees admitted or paroled into the U.S. and adult aliens not classified as nonimmigrants under the provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended.
	Other institutionalized Adult. Adults who are patients or residents of a medical or special institution, but not in correctional facilities or classified as "homeless adults."

Individuals imprisoned or otherwise detained pursuant to an Act of the Congress or a state law are not, by definition, included. G Public Assistance. An individual receiving financial assistance from federal, state and/or local programs, such as aid for dependent children, senior citizens assistance, general assistance and aid to the blind or totally disabled.
