

Children with Disabilities in Prekindergarten Programs, 2009-10

Background

- Florida's prekindergarten program for children with disabilities is an entitlement program required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Under IDEA, all eligible children with disabilities ages 3 through 21, are entitled to a free and appropriate public education. The services provided to these students are funded, in large part, through the FEFP. This brief addresses prekindergarten students served under IDEA.
- Florida also participates in the IDEA, Part C Program for infants and toddlers, ages birth through two years, with disabilities. Participation in this program is permissive for local school districts and funding for participating districts is generated through the FEFP.
- Consistent with federal requirements, school districts locate children who are potentially eligible for services under IDEA and link them with needed services. The goal of this child find service is to ensure children and youth who are potentially eligible for services are located, screened, evaluated, and provided with appropriate educational services.

Prekindergarten Students as Percent of Total Membership

- Data from the 2009 fall student survey, displayed in Figure 1, indicate that **2 percent** of the total membership in public schools is prekindergarten children (this includes all PK children served by the district including those in collaboration with local coalitions, district Head Start programs, migrant prekindergarten programs, programs for children of teen parents, and children with disabilities)

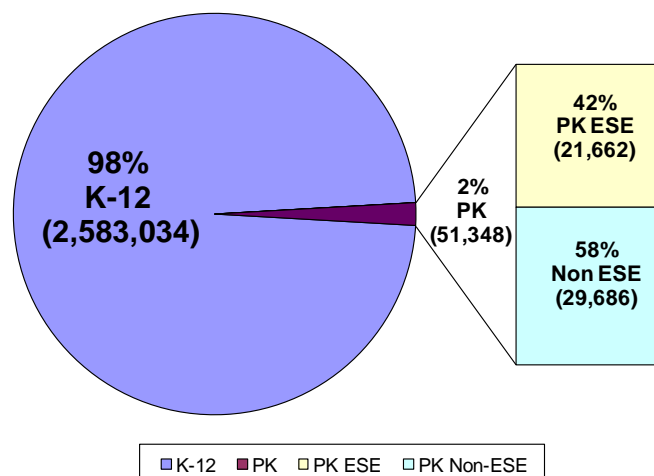
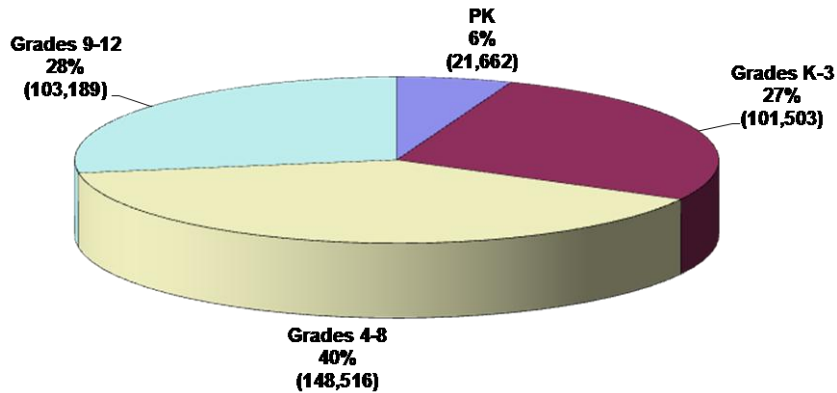


Figure 2: Students with Disabilities by Grade Grouping

- The October 2009 child count shows **6 percent** of all students with disabilities in public schools are in prekindergarten. These data are displayed in Figure 2.

Figure 1: District Prekindergarten Programs as Percent of Total Population

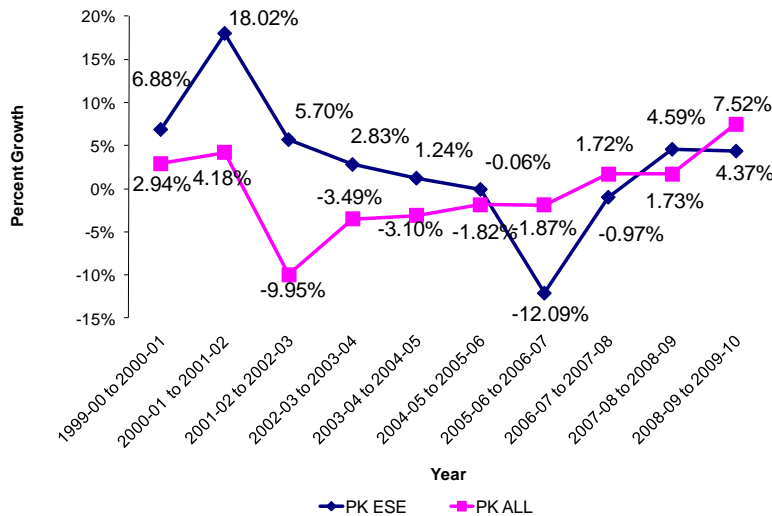

Growth in Prekindergarten Programs

- From 1999-00 through 2001-02, the total number of prekindergarten children grew **7.2 percent** (from 53,037 to 56,879). From 2001-02 to 2006-07, the total number fell 18.9% to 46,150, followed by a 11.3% increase to 51,348 from 2006-07 to 2009-10.
- From 1999-00 to 2005-06, the number of prekindergarten children with disabilities grew **38.9 percent** (from 16,406 to 22,794). From 2005-06 to 2007-08, the population declined 12.9 percent to 19,845 followed by growth of 9.2% to 21,662 from 2007-08 to 2009-10.
- Percent growth by year is shown in Figure 3.

State Funding of Prekindergarten Programs for Children with Disabilities

- Fourth calculation unweighted FTE for prekindergarten children with disabilities in 2009-10 was **17,908.56**. Weighted FTE for prekindergarten children with disabilities was **27,261.44**.
- Base Student Allocation (BSA) for 2009-10 is \$3,630.62.
- Prekindergarten students with disabilities generated approximately \$99 million in 2009-10 (WFTE x BSA)
- In addition to basic funding, districts received an additional \$981 million in the ESE Guaranteed Allocation. These monies are used to provide special education services to students with disabilities PK-12.
