<p>Students entering the above Associate in Applied Science and or the Associate in Science Program must have a standard high school diploma or its equivalent, or a CPT Eligible Certificate of Completion, and must meet the requirements of State Board Rule 6A-10.0315(3), FAC (College preparatory testing, placement, and instruction). Students earning scores less than those listed shall enroll in college preparatory communication and computation instruction.</p>			
<b>Validation Mechanism:</b>			
<p>To be eligible for articulation, the student must show evidence of their current <u>Emergency Medical Technician - Basic (EMT)</u> certification at the time of request for award of credit.</p>			
<b>Rationale/Justification:</b>			
<p>The <u>Emergency Medical Technician - Basic (EMT)</u> certification represents industry acknowledgement of technical skill attainment of competencies in the <u>Emergency Medical Services</u> program.</p>			
<b>Applicability:</b>			
<p>Florida College System institution administrators, program deans and faculty were consulted and agreed that the "<u>Emergency Medical Technician – Basic (EMT)</u>" certification shall articulate <b>nine (9)</b> college credit hours the AAS/AS Degree in <u>Emergency Medical Services</u>.</p>
