

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS FOR KOREAN CONFLICT VETERANS

In 2004, the Legislature passed legislation authorizing the Commissioner of Education to award a high school diploma to honorably discharged Korean Conflict veterans. Section 1003.428(10), Florida Statutes, provides for the award of a high school diploma to eligible Korean Conflict veterans.

Veterans who meet the following criteria will be eligible:

- Inducted into military service between June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955;
- Received an honorable discharge;
- Started high school between 1946-1950;
- Scheduled to graduate from high school between 1950-1954; and
- Resident of the state of Florida

The diplomas are for any veteran who currently resides in Florida, regardless of whether they were living in Florida at the time they went to high school. The Florida Department of Education will send a standard Florida high school diploma upon receiving a completed and notarized application along with your DD Form 214 or honorable discharge. Also, family members who would like to apply for a diploma posthumously may do so.
