

Definition of Secondary Concentrator:

A secondary student who has earned three (3) or more credits in a single career and technical education program, or two (2) credits in a single CTE program, but only in those programs where 2 credit sequences at the secondary level are recognized by the State and/or its local eligible recipients.*

*Concentrator, numerator, and denominator definitions are all from the State Plan

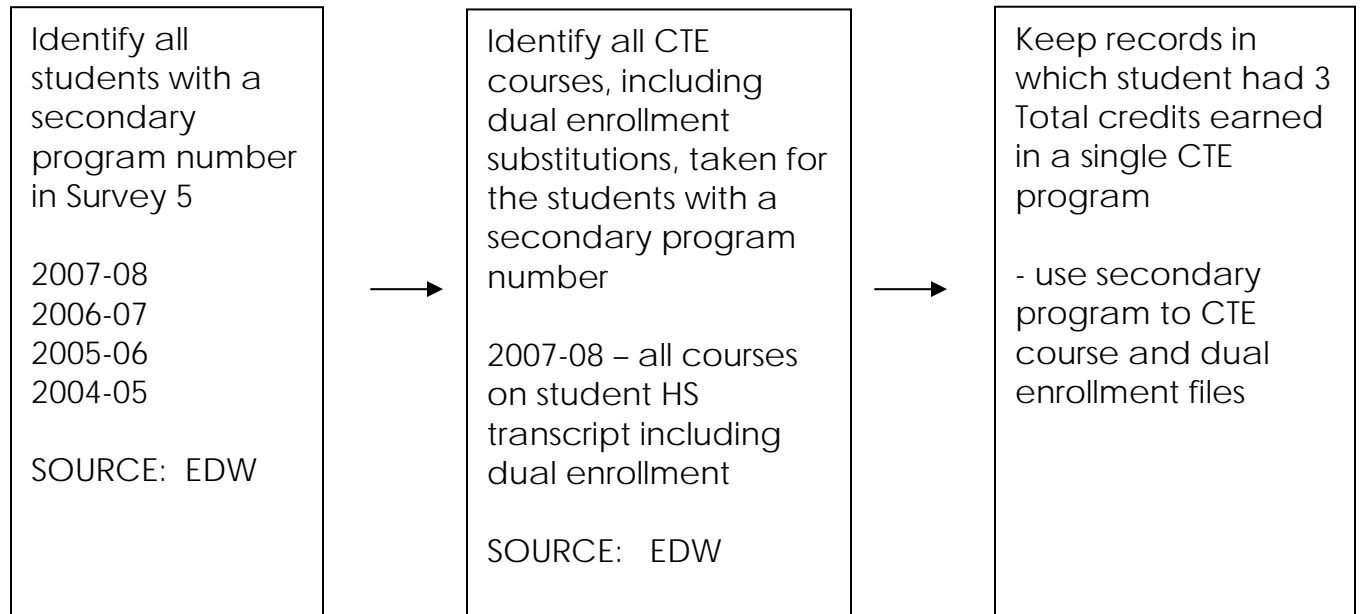

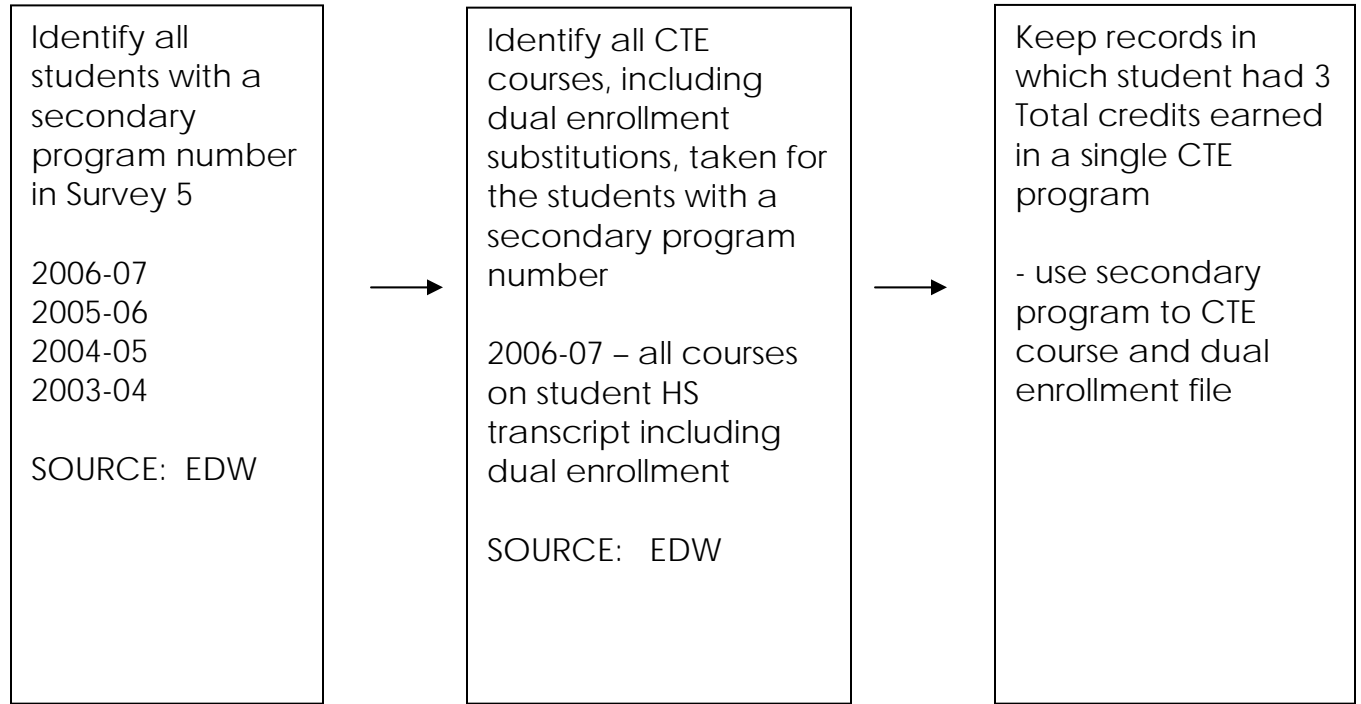
