Results

Data after action plan:

36 students of the targeted group met our goal by achieving a score of 456 Lexile or higher. 28 students did not meet the goal 456, but did show growth according to the spring SRI score. 3 students showed a decrease in Lexile according to the spring SRI. 3 students stayed at their original level.

Impact:

51% of the targeted group earned a score of 456 or above on their Spring SRI scores. 40% made annual learning gains.

Principal's Comments

Support from our guidance team has enhanced student learning during the 06-07 school year. The Measure plan provides a focused method of offering interventions to target groups of students.

Systemic Changes

In addition to providing a safe and respectful school climate, we extended our services to assist "at risk" students and focus interventions on improving their reading achievement.

School improvement Issues

At risk students were getting extra services. Our focus was to improve the growth and SRI scores in reading and decrease 3rd grade retentions. We need to expand our future focus to look at the "cut point" students.
