Questions: Current Rule Development Feedback Forms 2018 Workshop
<b>New feedback forms were provided at the July 2018 Rule Development Workshop, which included 10 attendees. To date, the department has not received feedback for this workshop. The topics that were presented are below.</b>
The attendance component should award credit for 95% attendance, even if the rate is lower than it was prior to attending the DJJ schools, if the student returns to a non-DJJ public school following release.
The graduation component should be based on 12th grade students rather than cohort-based.
The qualified teachers component should be limited to core-curricula courses as defined in the class-size rule.
The postsecondary enrollment component should be based on students who have earned a standard diploma or GED.
The employment component should be based on students who are at least 16 years old and who are not also in school.
