ALL COSTS INCURRED BY EACH APPLICANT IN COMPLETING ITEMS 1 THROUGH 7 BELOW SHALL BE AT ITS OWN RISK. THE COSTS OF EACH EXCHANGE SHALL BE ASSUMED BY THE APPLICANT INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ALL APPRAISALS, ALL SURVEYS, ALL TITLE SEARCHES, ALL ESA'S, AND ALL RECORDING FEES.  - c. Aerial photographs with each parcel identified thereon;
 - d. Statement describing the need and proposed use or development plans for the state-owned parcel sought for exchange or for the privately-owned parcel if a state agency application for exchange;
 - e. Statement describing the public benefits that will occur as a result of the exchange;
 - f. Names and addresses, as shown on the latest county tax assessment roll, of all owners of land lying within a 500-foot radius of the state land proposed for exchange, certified by the county property appraiser; and
 - g. Satisfactory evidence of marketable title to the property being offered for exchange.

PART I: INSTRUCTIONS AND CRITERIA REQUIRED IN ORDER FOR A PRIVATE LANDOWNER TO APPLY FOR AN EXCHANGE

PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 18-2.018(3)(b), FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, A PRIVATE LANDOWNER MAY APPLY FOR AN EXCHANGE OF LAND VESTED IN THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES ONLY IF IT OWNS LAND WHICH IS LISTED ON A STATE-APPROVED LAND ACQUISITION LIST (THE FLORIDA FOREVER ACQUISITION LIST) AND IF THE STATE-OWNED PARCEL SOUGHT BY THE PRIVATE LANDOWNER HAS BEEN DECLARED SURPLUS AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 18-2.018, FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.

After determining that its property is listed on a state-approved acquisition list and that the state-owned property it wishes to acquire has been declared surplus by the Board of Trustees, private applicants may submit a completed application along with all exhibits pertaining to the proposed exchange as required above.
