#### Florida Standards Review Progress

- Consensus calls with teacher experts to develop first drafts
- Consulted with national experts in math and ELA
- Grades 9-12 and 6-8 first draft posted for public comment in May
- Grades K-5 first draft posted for public comment in July
- Continued work on K-12 standards incorporating feedback from public and specialty stakeholders
- Grades K-12 second draft now posted for public input



#### Florida Standards Review Next Steps

- Hold listening tours across the state
- Conduct national expert reviews
- Prepare final report for Governor due January 1, 2020
- Present revised standards to State Board of Education in January 2020


### **Reviewing CTE Programs for Quality**

- Goal
  - Ensure all active, approved CTE programs lead to occupations with high demand, high skills, and/or middle- to high-level wages
- Deliverables
  - Program Quality Indicators
  - Benchmarks for Quality
  - State Program Quality Report
  - List of Programs to be Phased Out
- Phases (Staggered roll out)
  - Phase 1: Statewide review of programs
  - Phase 2: Local program review
  - Phase 3: Share information and best practices

  - CareerSource, DEO, Enterprise Florida, Council of 100, Board of Governors, district and college leaders, business & industry
- Three expert groups (47 experts)






# Process of Determining Programs Meeting/Not Meeting Benchmarks






### **Coach Aaron Feis Guardian Program**

- Currently, there are 39 school districts that have approved Guardian programs or intend to have Guardians; of those, 37 have Guardians in their schools.
- Applications for 2019-20 Guardian Program are now being accepted (for both new and expanding programs), with approximately \$52,348,423.87 available for funding.
