EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

School, District and State Report Cards were developed by the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) to meet the requirements set forth by the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965* as amended by the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA), which require states and districts to publish report cards that show how schools are doing with regard to student achievement and success.

The Florida Report Cards, which are available in the EduData portal (<http://edudata.fldoe.org>), create greater than ever transparency by providing data visualizations to help parents and other stakeholders easily understand how schools are doing compared to the district and state on key components of Florida's accountability system, subgroup performance, and other measures of student achievement and school environment.

The report cards include information about: the overall summative rating (district grade, school grade or school improvement rating); the breakdown of each component in the overall rating; whether a school is identified for support and detailed reasons for the identification; academic achievement, growth and participation, including alternate assessment participation; English Language Learners' proficiency and progress; middle school and college and career acceleration; discipline and attendance; graduation and postsecondary continuation; long-term goals and interim progress; accelerated course enrollment; preschool enrollment; educator qualifications and equity; per-pupil expenditures; and national assessment data.
