

#### **Executive Summary:**

The Florida-Specific Youth Survey (FSYS) is aligned to required instruction for Health Education, pursuant to section 1003.42(2)(n), Florida Statutes, (2022), including Resiliency Education, Civic and Character Education and Life Skills Education, which will inform enhanced alignment of services, support and instruction to better meet the needs of our students.


The FSYS has two sections: (a) Resilience and (b) Health Behavior. The Health Behavior Section of the FSYS outlines the data collected from a sample of Florida high school students during spring of the 2022-2023 school year (n = 2,787).

The Health Behavior Section is separated into 10 domains: Injury Prevention and Safety, Internet Safety, Nutrition, Personal Health, Prevention and Control of Disease, Substance Use and Abuse, Child Trafficking Prevention Education, Teen Dating Violence and Abuse, Sexual Abstinence and Resiliency Education.



























# The percentage of students aware of the signs and symptoms of the following diseases:










# The percentage of students who have ever consumed the following substances:




















