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Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)

Total = \$10,947,496,726

CARES ESSER I = \$770,247,851

- LEA Portion = \$693 million
- SEA Portion = \$77 million

- SEA Portion = \$313 million

Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER)

Total = \$249,384,820

These funds are being used throughout the state to support our students and educators as they address learning loss and ensure we continue to offer a world-class education for all students.

Child Care Supplemental Disaster Funds (CCDF)

Total CCDF (CARES, CRRSA, ARP) = \$3,062,053,160

A major focus across the rounds of CCDF federal relief funding has been phase grants to child care providers to support the continued operation and the provision of essential early learning services throughout Florida.

Policy Highlight

STUDENT K-12 ASSESSMENTS & ACCOUNTABILITY

HB 1193 by Placencia + SB 1048 by Diaz

- Eliminating the FSA, protecting Florida's nationally ranked (#1) accountability system and empower educators, parents and students to a level never seen before.
- Creating a revolutionary statewide diagnostic progress monitoring system for VPK through grade 10 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics that will persistently monitor a student's academic progress, while focusing on students' growth and learning gaps.
- Consistent data collection and reporting used up to 3x times throughout the year to determine areas of focus for the state, districts, schools and educators.

Budget Updates

- Senate and House released the text of their proposed General Appropriations bills and related implementing and conforming bills that are being considered at the Appropriations Committee meetings today.
- Both respective chambers' budgets slightly surpass the Governor's proposed budget of \$99.7 billion.
- The Senate proposed \$108.6 billion and \$28.438 billion for education.
- The House is proposing almost \$105.3 billion and \$28.025 billion for education.
- Between the two chambers that is a \$412 million difference for their proposed education budgets.



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
