Rule 6A-10.024 Proposed Amendment – Credit for Military Experience

- House Bill 171 (2020) amended section 1004.096, Florida Statutes (F.S.), requiring a process for the uniform award of postsecondary credit or career education clock hours to service members and veterans of the United States Armed Forces.
- In January 2021, the SBOE approved the process, reaffirming Florida as a military friendly state for postsecondary educational attainment. This rule advances our commitment to our veterans.
- Subject area discipline committees subsequently convened to review the American Council on Education Military Guide recommendations and determine postsecondary credit or clock hour awards for military courses and occupations.



Rule 6A-10.024 Proposed Amendment – Credit for Military Experience Cont'd

- The rule amendment incorporates new language related to the uniform award of postsecondary credit to eligible service members or veterans for college-level training and education acquired in the military.
- The revised language includes adoption of the Credit or Clock Hour Military Experience Equivalency List, which identifies postsecondary course equivalencies and the minimum postsecondary credit or career education clock hours that must be awarded for courses taken and for occupations held during an individual's military service.
- Lastly, the amendment incorporates an updated Credit-by-Exam Equivalencies document, pursuant to section 1007.27, F.S.
