

Survey Update

State Board of Education October 19, 2022





Following the August State Board of Education meeting, DOE surveyed all school districts

- 31 districts indicated that they had one or more relevant policies
 - Alachua, Bay, Brevard, Broward, Citrus, Duval, Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, Florida Virtual School, Gadsden, Hamilton, Hillsborough, Holmes, Indian River, Lee, Leon, Madison, Manatee, Martin, Miami-Dade, Okaloosa, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Johns, Sumter, University of Florida Lab School, Volusia, Wakulla
- 1 district did not respond to the survey
 - Santa Rosa



Of the 31 districts with relevant polices:

- 11 districts have policies or procedures that appear to be contrary to state or federal law.
 - 5 districts are still operating based on policies prior to the 2022 changes in law and those polices appear to be noncompliant based on an initial review.
 - Alachua, Broward, Hillsborough, Indian River, Miami-Dade
 - 6 districts are operating on updated policies that still appear to be noncompliant based on an initial review
 - Brevard, Duval, Florida Virtual, Florida School for the Deaf and Blind, Leon, Palm Beach
 - 3 districts actually direct that their policies not comply with state law.
 - Alachua, Broward, Leon
