

Element Name: Homeless Individuals or Runaway Youth

Definition

Indicate the homeless (individual, children, and youth or runaway youth) status of a student at the time of entry for the reporting year.

<u>Code</u>	<u>Definition/ Example</u>
A	<p>Student lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; this includes an individual who is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; -living in a motel, hotel, trailer park, or campground due to a lack of alternative adequate accommodations; -is living in an emergency or transitional shelter, -is abandoned in a hospital; -is awaiting foster care placement.
B	Student has a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, such as a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground.
C	Student is a migratory child who in the preceding 36 months was required to move from one school district to another due to changes in the parent’s seasonal employment in agriculture, dairy, or fishing work.
D	Student is under 18 years of age and absents himself or herself from home or place of legal residence without the permission of his or her family (i.e., runaway youth).
N	Student does not meet the conditions described above.
