D	Basic Skills Exempt: An adult student who is enrolled in an apprenticeship program that is registered with the Department of Education in accordance with Chapter 446, Florida Statutes, pursuant to Rule 6A-10.040 (8)(d).	
F	Basic Skills Exempt: An adult student with a disability as defined in s. 1004.02(7), F.S. who is exempt from meeting the required basic skills mastery level based on school district and Florida college institutions local policies adopted per s. 1004.91 (3)(a), F. S. (Rule 6A- 10.040(4), S.B.E.).	
G	The program is not subject to the basic skills requirement per 1004.91, F.S.; The total career certificate program length as indicated in the curriculum frameworks is less than 450 clock hours pursuant to Section 1004.91, F.S	
Н	Basic Skills Exempt. A student is enrolled in a law enforcement officer basic recruit training program and he or she is a veteran as defined in s. 1.01(14), F.S., or holds an associate degree or higher from an accredited college or university pursuant to Rule 6A-10.040 (8)(e). Note: Correctional Officer and Correctional Probation Officer programs and students do not apply to this exemption.	
N	Student has not yet completed the initial assessment.	
Ρ	Student has completed initial assessment but has not demonstrated mastery of the required minimal level of basic skills for the program in which the student is enrolled.	
Q	Basic Skills Exempt: Student possesses a high school diploma from a private school that is in compliance with s. 1002.42, F.S.	

R Basic Skills Exempt: Student was in a home education program and a signed affidavit has been submitted by the student's parent or legal guardian attesting that the student has completed a home education program pursuant to the requirements of s. 1002.41, F.S.

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S	Basic Skills Exempt: Student was in a personalized education program and a signed affidavit has been submitted by the student's parent or legal guardian attesting that the student has completed a personalized education program pursuant to the requirements of s. 1002.395, F.S.
Y	Student has demonstrated mastery of the required minimal level of basic skills for the program in which the student is enrolled utilizing the assessments listed in Rule 6A-10.040 $(1)(a) - (e)$ , F. A. C.

Ζ Not Applicable. (Student is not enrolled in a career certificate program)

Note: This element is not intended to show students met postsecondary readiness requirements for dual enrollment. For dual enrollment students, the reported value should indicate the status of the student in meeting the basic skills requirement of the specific program they are enrolled in, or if the program meets one of the basic skill exemptions specified in s. 1004.91, F.S.
