



Statewide Florida College Workforce Education Headcount by Program Area





Breakout: Statewide Florida College Adult General Education Headcount by Program





Top Ten Florida College Associate in Science/Applied Science Program Enrollments





Top Ten Florida College Career Certificate Program Enrollments




