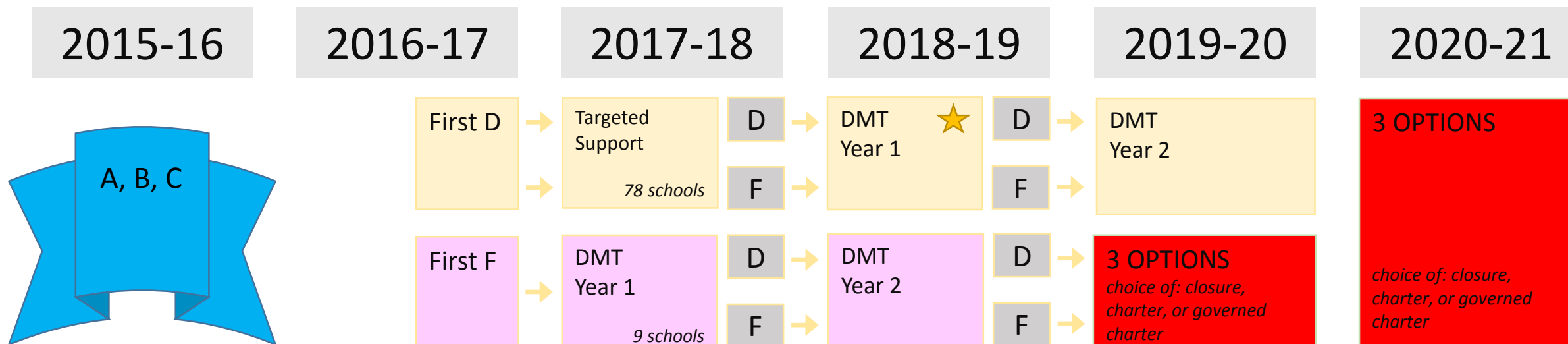


New Differentiated Accountability Flow

- For schools that earned their first sequential F in the 2016-17 school year, district-managed turnaround will begin in the 2017-18 school year.
- Schools that earned their first sequential D in the 2016-17 school year will use the 2017-18 school year to plan for district-managed turnaround.
- This pattern represents the flow specified by the bill for districts and schools moving forward.



HB 7069 Update

Scenario 1 – Green or Pink

Schools that have not implemented a district-managed turnaround plan

(205 schools → 77 schools; 3 “I” grades; 9 new “F”)

- These schools must implement a district-managed turnaround plan immediately when school starts in 2017-18

Scenario 2 – Orange

Schools that have an approved district-managed turnaround plan and have completed one year of a two-year plan

(67 schools → 25 schools)

- These schools continue the approved two-year plan
- If the State Board imposed conditions or reporting when the plan was approved, these still apply
- School does not need to get a new district-managed turnaround plan approved

HB 7069 Update

Scenario 3 – Blue

Schools that have completed two years of their district-managed turnaround plan and have been planning for a hybrid option

(5 schools → 3 schools)

- These schools will come before the State Board on July 17

Scenario 4 – Goldenrod

Schools that have completed two years of district-managed turnaround plan and have completed one year of a two-year hybrid plan

(42 schools → 12 schools)

- These schools will continue the turnaround plan for one year
