FLORIDA COLLEGE SYSTEM MONTH

WHEREAS, the Florida College System is comprised of 28 public state colleges and community colleges and joins a month-long national celebration of innovation, achievements, and successes in community colleges; and

WHEREAS, Florida College System institutions provide access to high-quality, affordable academic and career educational programs that maximize student success across the entire state, foster innovation, and develop a globally competitive workforce, while responding nimbly to state and community needs; and

WHEREAS, Florida is ranked the #1 public higher education system in the nation by *U.S. News and World Report* for the sixth consecutive year; and

WHEREAS, U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges recognized five Florida College System institutions in the top 100 in four separate categories: Best Regional College, South; Best Online Bachelor's Programs; Best Online Bachelor's Programs for Veterans; and Least Debt Regional College, South; and

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis has committed over \$5 billion to workforce education initiatives since 2019, including programs to expand training options at Florida College System institutions in healthcare, transportation, technology, construction, manufacturing, education, and public safety; and

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis has announced \$59 million for new programs in nursing and health education to increase the capacity of Florida College System institutions to produce nurses and other critical healthcare workers; and

WHEREAS, in 2021-2022, Florida College System institutions enrolled nearly 640,000 students, including 63,000 active-duty service members, veterans, and reservists, and spouses and dependents, and Florida College System students earned more than 135,000 degrees, certificates, and industry certifications; and

WHEREAS, the Florida College System is the state's workforce talent pipeline, and plays a vital role in making Florida #1 in workforce education by 2030, and since 2019, nearly 210,000 rapid credentials have been awarded to Florida College System students; and

WHEREAS, 90 percent of the 2020-21 Florida College System graduates who earned workforce credentials are employed or continuing their education in Florida; and

WHEREAS, Florida College System baccalaureate degree graduates earn an average of nearly \$65,000 a year in the year following graduation and Associate in Science graduates earn an average of over \$56,000 in their first year after graduation; and

WHEREAS, in 2021-22, 62 percent of Associate in Arts completers transferred into upper division programs through Florida's renown 2+2 system, with 45 percent in state universities and 17 percent in Florida College System workforce baccalaureate programs; and

WHEREAS, more than 76,000 secondary students completed college courses through dual enrollment in the Florida College System in 2021-2022, with a 93 percent course passage rate, saving Florida families approximately \$58 million in tuition and fees in one year; and

WHEREAS, one Florida College System institution has either won the prestigious \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence or has been recognized as finalist or a finalist with distinction every year since the contest's inception in 2011, and in 2023 a Florida College System institution is again named a finalist for the Prize.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ron DeSantis, Governor of the State of Florida do hereby extend greeting and best wishes to all observing April 2023 as *Florida College System Month*.
