

**Draft FCAT 2.0/EOC Achievement Level Policy Definitions**

<b>Level 5</b>	This student has demonstrated mastery of the most challenging content of the <i>Next Generation Sunshine State Standards</i> . For high school assessments, a student scoring in Level 5 has the potential to meet college readiness standards by the time he or she graduates from high school.
<b>Level 4</b>	This student has demonstrated an above satisfactory level of success with the challenging content of the <i>Next Generation Sunshine State Standards</i> . A student scoring in Level 4 answers most of the test questions correctly, but may have only some success with questions that reflect the most challenging content.
<b>Level 3</b>	This student has demonstrated a satisfactory level of success with the challenging content of the <i>Next Generation Sunshine State Standards</i> . A student scoring in Level 3 answers many of the test questions correctly but is generally less successful with questions that are the most challenging.
<b>Level 2</b>	This student has demonstrated a below satisfactory level of success with the challenging content of the <i>Next Generation Sunshine State Standards</i> . A student scoring in Level 2 is generally most successful with questions that are the least challenging.
<b>Level 1</b>	This student has demonstrated an inadequate level of success with the challenging content of the <i>Next Generation Sunshine State Standards</i> .
