

2022 Annual Program Performance Reports Summary and Analysis

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Florida Department of Education is committed to working alongside parents, teachers, educators and community members to provide the highest quality opportunities for all students. This report shares the scores of Florida's state-approved teacher preparation programs in 2022 using performance measures that are outlined in Florida law and State Board Education Rule.¹ As outlined in law and state board rule, programs receive summative score ratings and ratings on five performance metrics: placement rate, retention rate, student performance on state assessments, student subgroup performance on state assessments, and teacher evaluation. Teacher preparation programs educating future teachers in critical shortage subjects may also earn a bonus rating. Ensuring that teacher preparation programs in Florida are of high quality is critical to meeting the Department's goals for student achievement and academic success.

Recognizing teacher quality as the in-school factor with the greatest impact on student achievement, Florida has implemented new policies to strengthen teacher preparation, certification, recruitment, and retention in recent years, including:

- Invested in Florida's teachers, more than \$2 billion in state funds to reward and increase compensation for Florida's K-12 public school teachers, including now \$800 million in recurring state funds to raise minimum teacher salaries and increase veteran teacher salaries, a \$250 million increase over last year's funding of \$550 million.
- Passed two new pieces of legislation in 2021, House Bills (HB) 7011 and 1159, that further strengthened the state's commitment to improving teacher preparation, created additional alternative pathways to demonstrating subject matter competency towards certification, and supported the state's bold goal of having 90% of all students performing at or above grade level by the end of grade three on the state's reading and language arts assessment by 2024.
- Reviewed teacher preparation accountability system metrics based on feedback from a State Board of Education (SBOE)-initiated third-party audit completed in 2021 and enacted Senate Bill (SB) 2524 in 2022 to address the audit recommendations.

Report Finding Highlights

- **Summative Scores**—106 of 320 programs (33%) had enough performance data to receive a 2022 summative score ranking, an increase of one percentage point over 2021.
 - Note, this trend of being unable to provide summative scores to programs was a key impetus to the 2021 SBOE-initiated third-party audit and subsequent legislation, SB 2524.
- Progress Trends—More programs' summative scores increased than decreased between 2021 and 2022. Forty-nine programs improved their summative scores, while 34 programs' scores went down.
- Placement Rate—178 of 320 programs (56%) received a placement rate score in 2022. Among the programs receiving a score, the average placement rate score was 3.0, a slight upward trend over 2021.
- **Retention Rate**—180 of 320 programs (58%) received a retention rate score for 2022. All but three rated programs received a score of 3.0 or 4.0. The average retention rate was 3.29, comparable to last year's rate of 3.30.
- **Student Performance**—116 of 320 programs (36%) received a score for student learning growth on statewide assessments for 2022. The average score for program performance of students on statewide assessments assigned to completers was 3.06, higher than the average of 2.87 last year.
- Student Subgroup Performance—116 programs received a score for student subgroup performance on statewide assessments. The average score for program performance by subgroups assigned to completers in 2022 was 2.60, slightly down from 2.70 in 2021.
- **Teacher Evaluations**—235 of 320 programs (73%) received a teacher evaluation score for 2022.
- Bonus Metric-Critical Shortage Areas—40 of 157 eligible programs (25%) received the critical shortage area bonus.

Recommendations

The following recommendations are made based upon Florida's current teacher preparation accountability system. Some of these recommendations align to findings and recommendations from the 2021 SBOE-initiated third-party audit, and last year's January 2022 version of this teacher preparation audit report and are being addressed as a result of that report and through implementation of SB 2524. Florida should continue to act with urgency in addressing these recommendations and implementing the requirements of SB 2524.

 Increase the number of programs that can be ranked by addressing the causes of unscored metrics and reevaluating the number of subscores required.



- Implement alternative weighting formulas based on evaluation data quality, rigorousness, and differentiation between programs.
- Align the application of the critical shortage area bonus metric to ensure it is meeting the objective of incentivizing and rewarding the production of the most needed teachers, while also aligning with the supply versus demand approach of the 2021 REACH Act, and further aligning with how districts and schools are truly recruiting, hiring and retaining teachers with in-demand competencies.
- Modify teacher preparation program accountability system business rules to make resulting data more meaningful, elevate and replicate best practice programs, and correct low-performing programs.
- Develop and disseminate model surveys with a set of required items for all programs to meet the new accountability requirement, facilitate implementation, and maximize comparability across programs.
- Continue to develop a dissemination strategy that ensures these findings reach the intended audiences, including the SBOE's strategy of the last two years to continually marry the findings of this report with the presentation of the annual critical shortage report, and any ongoing initiatives of the Governor, SBOE and Legislature (e.g., the Governor and Department's forthcoming development of a teacher apprenticeship model).



INTRODUCTION

For half a century, teacher quality has been recognized as the single in-school factor that has the greatest impact on student achievement. In fact, according to research on student performance on reading and math tests, teachers are estimated to have two to three times the impact of any other school factor.²

Additionally, beyond the immediate impact on student performance, effective teachers have also been shown to have long-term impacts on their students' lives. Elementary students assigned to high value-added teachers have been shown to be more likely to attend college and to earn higher salaries.³ Furthermore, teacher preparation and certification are critical components of ensuring the quality and effectiveness of teachers and have been demonstrated to be the strongest correlates of student achievement in reading and mathematics.⁴

Considering these findings, ensuring that teacher preparation programs in Florida are of high quality is critical to meeting the state's goals for student achievement and academic success. As a result, the state of Florida continues to implement policies to support teacher recruitment, preparation, and retention, including Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System, focused on ensuring that every student has an effective teacher every year.

The state of Florida has spent more than \$2 billion to raise teacher salaries and reward teachers since the 2020 legislative session. During the most recent legislative session, for instance, the state allocated \$800 million in recurring Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) categorical funds to raise minimum teacher salaries. This is a \$250 million increase from the \$550 million investment the previous year.

Furthermore, Florida has expanded opportunities to become a teacher, with twelve pathways now available. This includes the creation of the Military Veterans Certification Pathway, which provides a temporary teaching certificate to eligible military veterans. Candidates in this program are provided additional time to obtain a professional certificate. This is coupled with a new option for candidates to satisfy the General Knowledge requirement by earning a master's degree from an approved and accredited institution.

On January 31, 2019, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 19-32, outlining a path for Florida to improve its education system by eliminating Common Core and paving the way for Florida students to receive a world class education to prepare them for jobs of the future. In response, the Florida Department of Education (Department) undertook an aggressive effort to revise and implement new English language arts and mathematics academic standards. These revised standards, known as Florida's Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking, or B.E.S.T. Standards, were approved by the Florida State Board of Education along with an aggressive three-year implementation plan that ensures that all B.E.S.T. Standards are fully implemented and new assessments to measure their success are in place by 2023.

In March 2022, Governor DeSantis signed legislation creating the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) plan, eliminating the end-of-year Florida Standards Assessments. FAST assessments, starting in the 2022–2023 school year, will be administered three times during the year: the first assessment, administered at the beginning of the school year, is designed to provide a baseline score; the second, provides a midyear score; the third, an end-of-year summative score. This summative score will be used for school accountability beginning in 2023–2024.

Additionally, the State Board of Education in November 2019 established a bold goal to have 90% of all Florida students performing at or above grade level by the end of grade three by 2024. Florida has invested in establishing regional literacy directors and teams to support districts and schools in meeting the needs of their most vulnerable students. Beginning in the 2022–2023 academic year, teacher candidates in certain certification areas⁵ must complete the state's reading endorsement. Furthermore, school district and instructional personnel who supervise or direct teacher preparation candidates in these certification areas must hold a Florida educator's certificate or endorsement in reading.

Florida continues to take steps to maintain rigorous accountability systems for state teacher preparation programs. In 2021, the Department commissioned an audit to review the impact of the continued approval process and Annual Program Performance Report (APPR) on programs. Florida has made legislative changes to the continued approval process in response to this report and is currently in the process of undergoing a review of the APPR process.

The analysis in this report does not reflect recent statutory changes related to Senate Bill 2524; however, the Department is currently engaged in the rulemaking process to implement these changes. These revisions will be reflected in future versions of this report. The Department has continued to provide technical support and guidance to teacher preparation programs, including training needed to implement Florida's state academic standards and other priority areas.

This report is presented to fulfill the requirement of Section 1004.04, Florida Statutes (F.S.), detailed in the State Board of Education Rule 6A-5.066, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). This rule requires the Department to report the results of each approved teacher preparation program's annual progress on established performance measures⁶ as well as each program's current approval status. In accordance with the statute, this report must be made available to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the State Board of Education, the Board of Governors, the Commissioner of Education, Florida teacher preparation programs, school district superintendents, and the general public. As the 2022 edition, this report reflects data corresponding to teacher preparation program completers employed in the 2019–2020 school year. It provides comparative data⁷ from Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System to support programs in efforts to continuously improve their content, delivery, and outcomes and to inform policymakers and consumers, including school districts and prospective teacher candidates, about individual program strengths and weaknesses. This report also includes an analysis of the Florida Teacher Certification Examination (FTCE) performance data on the Elementary Education Examination and its subtests. FTCE performance data for other subject areas with significant numbers of teacher candidates are also provided.

This report provides a brief overview of teacher preparation in Florida and the state's Teacher Preparation Accountability System, followed by:

- Summative findings rank the overall performance of programs with sufficient data;
- Analysis of each metric used to measure program performance;
- Recommendations for further developing and enhancing the accountability system for consideration by Florida policymakers; and
- Analysis of the FTCE data.

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Details about the specific timeframe associated with each performance measure are provided in Exhibit 6.

The data set does not allow for testing of statistically significant differences among the programs. Additionally, there is large variability in the data set, including the size of programs and the number of subscores available for each program.

TEACHER PREPARATION IN FLORIDA

There are three types of state-approved programs for new teacher certification in Florida: Initial Teacher Preparation Programs (ITPs), Educator Preparation Institutes (EPIs), and Professional Development Certification Programs (PDCPs).

Initial Teacher Preparation Programs are offered at postsecondary institutions and typically culminate in a bachelor's or master's degree. This is the more traditional pathway to eligibility for educator certification.

Educator Preparation Institutes provide an alternate route to educator certification for prospective teachers including career changers and college graduates who already hold at a minimum a bachelor's degree. EPI candidates may work as teachers of record while earning their full certification. EPIs are provided by public and private postsecondary institutions as well as private providers.

Professional Development Certification Programs are another alternate route to educator certification for prospective teachers that already hold at a minimum a bachelor's degree. PDCPs are offered by school districts, charter schools, and charter management organizations that allow members of their instructional staff with temporary certificates to work while earning their full certification.

Florida has 3998 teacher preparation programs. Thirty-four are offered by local school districts, 66 by the Florida College System, 175 by the State University System, 118 by private institutions of higher education (IHEs), three by private providers, and three by charter school systems.

Of the 399 programs, 24 are EPIs and 34 are district-run PDCPs. The majority of programs in the state, 338, are ITPs. ITPs may offer multiple subject-area programs; for example, the University of South Florida offers 35 distinct programs, substantially more than the number offered by any other provider.



Thirteen institutions provide both EPIs and at least one ITP: Broward College, Daytona State College, Eastern Florida State College, Florida Gateway College, Florida Gulf Coast University, Florida State College at Jacksonville, Indian River State College, Miami Dade College, Polk State College, St. Johns River State College, St. Petersburg College, University of Florida, and University of West Florida.

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

In 2022 there were 96 providers of teacher preparation programs in Florida. Per Rule 6A-5.066, F.A.C., eligible providers of teacher preparation programs are Florida postsecondary institutions, private providers, school districts, charter schools, and charter school management organizations. Of the 96 providers, 34 districts and three charter schools operate their own PDCPs. Most other providers are institutions of higher education (IHEs), including 32 public IHEs and 24 private IHEs. There are also three non-IHE private providers.



The 338 ITPs cover a wide range of subject matter, with the most commonly offered program being Elementary Education, which is offered by more than 50 providers. Exhibit 5 shows the number of ITPs by subject area⁹.

Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System

Florida sets and holds teacher preparation programs to performance metrics as outlined in the Florida Statutes and State Board of Education rule with the goal of improving teacher preparedness and ultimately leading to increased outcomes for Florida's students. The state publishes annual reports on individual preparation programs and their performance against these metrics. Importantly, Florida evaluates providers at the program level as institutional scores can mask individual program performance in the aggregate. Aggregate means that programs are combined by common certification area for better reporting. For example, both undergraduate and graduate level mathematics programs can be grouped together for reporting purposes as they lead to the same certification. Program-level scores reported by the state¹⁰ allow prospective students and school districts to make more informed choices. Institutions are also provided annual continuous improvement information.

To measure program performance, the Department currently reviews the following data for each program annually:

- Placement rate of program completers into instructional positions in Florida public schools.
- Retention rate for employed program completers in instructional positions in Florida public schools.¹¹
- Performance of students in Pre-Kindergarten (PreK) through Grade 12 who are assigned to in-field program completers on statewide assessments using the results of Florida's student learning growth formula.
- Performance of students in PreK through Grade 12 who are assigned to in-field program completers aggregated by student subgroup.
- Results of program completers' annual teacher evaluations.
- Production of program completers in statewide critical teacher shortage areas.

The Annual Program Performance Report (APPR) is a yearly public report card issued by the Department for state-approved teacher preparation programs that include the performance metrics outlined in Figure 6. Programs receive a performance level score ranging from 1 (lowest) to 4 (highest) for the first 5 performance metrics. In addition, programs can receive bonus points for producing program completers in statewide critical teacher shortage areas. ¹² Each APPR report provides a summative rating score, between 1 and 4, that is an average of the first 5 performance level scores received. If the program is eligible for the critical teacher shortage area bonus, the summative rating score is calculated by multiplying the bonus score of 4 by 0.2 and adding it to the product of 0.8 and average of all other scores.

Teacher preparation programs in Florida are granted an initial program approval for a period of seven years. At the end of this period, a Continued Approval Score (CAS) is calculated for each program, consisting of three components. The first component is the average of all annual APPR summative rating scores within the current approval period. The second consists of scores from the Continued Approval Site Visit, conducted in the final year of the initial approval period. The third and final component is the score from an Evidence of Programmatic Improvement Rating, which is based on progress towards goals set in a provider's improvement plan. The final score is determined by weighting the APPR Average Summative Rating 50%, the Continued Approval Site Visit Rating 20%, and the Evidence of Programmatic Improvement Rating 30%. Full approval is granted to programs achieving a score of 2.4 or greater, with those 3.5 or greater receiving full approval with distinction.

Satisfaction surveys of program completers and their employers is a part of the program approval process¹⁵. Program completers are asked to provide feedback on their satisfaction with the preparation for the realities of the classroom. Employers provide feedback on their satisfaction with the program and the program's responsiveness to local school districts.

Teacher Preparation Program Audit

Florida contracted with a third party in 2021 to audit the impact of the state's accountability framework on teacher preparation programs. The audit was based on a full review of Florida statute, rules, and policies; interviews and surveys with state-approved teacher preparation programs and other stakeholders; and conversations with Department staff. The report includes findings and recommendations on APPR performance metrics and initial and continued approval processes for institutions.

The audit report found that APPR performance metrics did not result in ratings and scores for many teacher preparation programs. The report suggests this is due, in part, to sample size requirements and lack of individual metric subscores. In response, the report proposes six new APPR metrics and corresponding weights for determining an overall program score. The report recommended an APPR score for each teacher preparation program and a summative APPR score for institutions, which aggregates program scores using the proposed weights in Exhibit 7. The audit report also recommended elevating APPR score visibility and making the eIPEP¹⁶ (electronic Institutional Program Evaluation Plan, which is a state-maintained web-based tool

The audit report also provided findings and recommendations for the Continued Approval Process for teacher preparation programs. The report found that the Initial Approval Process is effective without recommendations. The Continued Approval site visit was found to be highly effective but is currently applied only to elementary and PreK-primary education programs. Therefore, the report recommended modifying the Continued Approval Process to ensure that all programs that meet a minimum threshold receive a site visit. In addition, the report recommended that state approval be removed from programs that fail to produce a minimum number of completers in a multiyear period.

2022 FLORIDA TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM PERFORMANCE


FINDING

Only 106 of 320 programs (33%) had enough performance data to receive a 2022 ranking.

As previously noted, in some instances similar programs within an institution are combined to increase the amount of available performance data that can be considered. These aggregations result in the analysis of 320 programs in this report. (See Appendix B for program aggregations.)

For this report, programs must have a minimum of four subscores to be ranked. Only 106 programs had the minimum subscores necessary for their summative ratings and resulting rankings to be presented here. Thus rankings are provided for just 33% of the analyzed programs, a slight increase from last year's report in which only 32% of programs had at least four subscores. The relatively low percentage is due in large part to the lack of statewide student growth data for teachers in certain grades and subjects. Prior to last year's (2021) report, no student growth data for EPIs and PDCPs were available. However, for 2022, 35 EPIs and PDCPs had at least four subscores, including a rating for the student growth measure, and are thus included in the 2022 rankings. Current business rules require at least four subscores for the scope of this report, so programs with associated student performance measures are highlighted.

FINDING

Nine programs share the top ranking in the state of Florida for 2022, including three professional development certification programs, three educator preparation institutes, and three initial teacher preparation programs.

Full program ratings, including all subscores, can be found in Appendix C. The average summative rating for ranked programs in 2022 is 3.3, an increase over the 2021 average rating of 3.1. The average summative rating score for the five years preceding 2021 was 3.0.

Prior reports have noted that some of the largest programs in the state generally have below average performance ratings. In 2022, three of the five largest programs are below the state average summative rating of 3.3. However, the third and fifth largest programs, Valencia College's Educator Preparation Institute and Florida Atlantic University's Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading and Elementary Education/ESOL (aggregated programs) have higher than average summative rating scores of 3.6 and 3.7, respectively.

APPR scores ranged from 3.8 to 2.6. Programs with scores between 3 and 4 are considered high performing.



Change in Program Performance Scores 2021–2022



FINDING

Middle Grades Mathematics at St. Petersburg College had the greatest increase in summative score, rising from a 2.2 in 2021 to a 3.4 in 2022. The Educator Preparation Institute at Santa Fe College and Mathematics/Mathematics (MAT) program at the University of South Florida had the greatest decrease, from a 3.4 in 2021 to a 2.6 in 2022.

ANALYSIS OF PERFORMANCE METRICS

Performance Metric 1—Placement Rate

Placement rate is defined as the number of program completers reported annually as employed in a full-time or part-time instructional position in a Florida public school district in either the first or second academic year subsequent to program completion.

When analyzing program data, there are a number of factors that can impact the placement rate of program completers. A high placement rate may indicate that program completers have little difficulty finding employment. A low placement rate may indicate that there is little demand for the new teachers produced by a given program. This could be a reflection of the perceived quality of new teachers trained by that program provider or could result from little demand in general for teachers of particular grades and subjects or regional variations in hiring. Additionally, a low placement rate may indicate that a program's completers are working as teachers out of state or in private schools or other settings that are not tracked by their institutions. Institutions have the option to complete forms for the inclusion of out-of-state and privately employed completers, but not all choose to do this. However, individual programs should analyze these data to more fully understand what their placement rate represents.

The implicit differences in demand for certain types of teachers are addressed in the scoring of this metric by comparing each program's placement rate to the average placement rate for all programs producing teachers of those grades and subjects. For example, programs producing elementary teachers are compared to the average placement rate for elementary teachers; programs producing secondary mathematics teachers are compared to the average placement rate for secondary mathematics teachers.

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
FINDING

178 out of 320 programs (56%) received a placement rate score for 2022. Among the programs receiving a score, the average placement rate score was 3.0, a slight upward trend since 2021.

Placement rate is not applicable to PDCPs, since candidates in these programs are already employed as teachers. This contributes to the high percentage of programs not rated on this metric, but 105 non-PDCPs are also not rated. 



Number of Programs by Subject Matter Receiving Highest Placement Scores⁶⁰







Average Score for Placement Rate by Program Type 2015–2022





Performance Metric 2—Retention Rate

Retention rate is defined as the average number of years that program completers are employed in a full-time or part-time instructional position in a Florida public school at any point each year in a five-year period following initial employment in either of the two subsequent academic years after program completion.

Average Retention Rate Score 2015–2022



Distribution of Retention Rate Scores





Exhibit 30 Average Score for Retention Rate by Program Type





Florida continues to have a much lower rate of new teacher attrition than nationally,⁶⁹ which indicates that 8% of teachers leave the profession every year with younger teachers and those early in their careers being the most likely to leave. High performance ratings on this metric do not appear to result from a low bar in scoring. To earn a score of 4.0, programs must have average retention among their completers of 4.5 out of five years, which appears to set a rigorous standard.

Performance Metric 3—Performance of PreK–Grade 12 Students on Statewide Assessments

This metric evaluates the extent to which program completers achieve learning gains for their students once teaching in the classroom. Performance of program completers' students is assessed through the student learning growth formula that is outlined in Section 1012.34, F.S. Student learning growth scores are calculated through a value-added model (VAM), designed to measure the amount a teacher contributes to student learning. The teacher preparation program accountability system looks at classroom performance through three specific lenses: student learning gains as measured in this indicator; student learning gains for specific student subgroups (see Performance Metric 4); and overall teacher evaluation results, which include classroom observations and student learning performance, as well as other measures used by districts (see Performance Metric 5).

Program scores for this metric are based on the performance of students assigned to in-field program completers from the previous three-year period who received a student learning growth score from the most recent academic year for which results are available. The scores of all such program completers are averaged. The score for this metric takes into account both the

average student learning growth score and the confidence interval, which considers the margin of error associated with that score⁷⁰.

Not all initial teacher preparation programs will have student learning growth scores. Only programs whose completers teach courses that have associated statewide assessments in English language arts (Grades 4–10), mathematics (Grades 4–8), and Algebra 1 will have the scores needed to evaluate this performance metric.

FINDING

Only 116 of 320 (36%) programs received a score for student learning growth for 2022. The average program score for performance of students on statewide assessments was 3.06, higher than the average of 2.87 last year.

Average Program Performance by Students on Statewide Assessments Score 2015–2022




Most of the 252 initial teacher preparation programs that are not rated are in subject areas for which there are no statewide assessments. Twenty-two of these programs are in subject areas, including English and mathematics, for which corresponding statewide assessment data would be expected although new teachers in these programs might teach grade levels in which no such assessment is given or programs might not have the required minimum of two completers to receive a score on this metric. As in 2021, only one program primarily focused on exceptional student education has a score for this metric, which is concerning given that students with disabilities are expected to meet the state academic standards, and all but a small percentage of students with disabilities are expected to take statewide assessments.

FINDING

Nine programs in the state earned a score of 4.0 on this metric, an increase over 2021 in which only two programs earned the highest score.







Exhibit 37 Distribution of Program Scores for Student Learning Growth Metric



Performance Metric 4—Performance of Student Subgroups on Statewide Assessments

This metric considers a different aspect of completers' contributions to student learning, specifically the performance of student subgroups. The intent is to measure how well the teacher preparation program prepares completers to work with a diverse population of students in a variety of settings in Florida schools, including economically disadvantaged students, students from major racial and ethnic groups, students with disabilities, and students with limited English proficiency as stated in State Board Rule 6A-5.066(1)(gg), F.A.C.

To calculate the learning gains of students by subgroup, teacher VAM scores are calculated and disaggregated for the following student subgroups: Caucasian, African American, Hispanic, Asian, Native American, Multiracial, students eligible for free or reduced lunch, students with disabilities, and English language learners. This metric considers the average student learning growth results by each subgroup as compared to the statewide average for these subgroups for all program completers with VAM scores. These percentages are compared to the statewide

percentages to determine the number of subgroups that met expectation or exceeded the statewide average to arrive at the program score⁷².



Distribution of Performance by Student Subgroups on Statewide Assessments Scores








Exhibit 44 Distribution of Program Scores for Subgroup Student Learning Growth Metric


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

Performance Metric 5—Teacher Evaluations

This metric considers the results of annual teacher evaluations from the most recent academic year for program completers from the previous three-year period. Florida requires that all teachers receive an annual evaluation that results in a rating of highly effective, effective, needs improvement (for teachers teaching more than three years) or developing (for teachers with experience of three years or less), or unsatisfactory.

School districts and charter schools develop their own teacher evaluation systems consistent with state law and guidelines. Growth or achievement data for the teacher's students and observation of instructional practice must each comprise at least one third of the evaluation. Other measures can be added at each charter school or districts' discretion. The inclusion of this metric, in addition to the metrics looking solely at student learning gains, is important for two reasons. First, this metric allows for consideration of other factors used by districts to evaluate teacher performance, including classroom observations. This metric also allows consideration of performance for many more teachers who do not teach grades or subjects associated with statewide assessments. Scoring for this metric is based on the percentage of teachers receiving highly effective and effective ratings.

Given disruptions due to COVID-19 in school year 2019–2020, Executive Order 2020-EO-02 suspended the requirement to conduct annual teacher evaluations in 2019–2020. However, the teacher evaluation metric was still required in the APPR. Therefore, the Department determined that all programs eligible to receive a score on the teacher evaluation metric were issued a score of 4.

235 out of 320 programs (73%) received a teacher evaluation score for 2022.

Average Program Score for Teacher Evaluations 2015–2022




Exhibit 47 Distribution of Teacher Evaluation Scores



As noted, in response to disruptions due to COVID-19, Executive Order 2020-EO-01 waived teacher evaluations for the 2019–2020 school year. However, the teacher evaluation metric was still required in the APPR. Therefore, the Department determined that all programs eligible to receive a score on the teacher evaluation metric were issued a score of 4. However, important context for understanding the analysis of this metric is that nearly all teachers in Florida receive an effective or highly effective rating on their evaluation. State data show that 98% of teachers receive an annual rating of effective or highly effective. Given the lack of differentiation among the underlying data, the high program scores in past years are not surprising.

Exhibit 49 Average Program Scores for Teacher Evaluation Metric








Exhibit 50 Distribution of Program Scores for Teacher Evaluation Metric





Bonus Metric—Critical Shortage Areas

The final metric in Florida's teacher preparation accountability system considers whether programs are producing teachers in critical shortage subject areas. Because, by design, many programs are not preparing teachers for these subject areas, this metric is not used to evaluate all programs as the other performance metrics are. Instead, eligible programs can earn bonus points that impact their summative scores and rankings.

Critical teacher shortage areas are determined and published each year by the State Board of Education in accordance with Rule 6A-20.0131, F.A.C. For the school year 2019–2020, the following were identified as critical shortage areas, in rank order:

- Science—General
- English
- Mathematics
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
- Science—Physical
- Reading
- Technical Education
- Exceptional Student Education (ESE)

Based on these identified areas, 157 of the 320 programs analyzed were eligible for the critical teacher shortage area bonus. To earn the bonus, eligible programs must have a minimum of two program completers and increase the number of program completers compared to the prior year.

FINDING

40 out of 157 eligible programs (25%) received the critical teacher shortage bonus.

Exhibit 51 Eligibility for Critical Teacher Shortage Area Bonus




Exhibit 52 Programs Awarded Critical Teacher Shortage Area Bonus



Combining multiple programs into a single unit of analysis for accountability purposes makes it challenging to accurately understand whether teacher preparation programs are helping to address chronic shortages. For instance, treating 'science' as a broad shortage category may mask important differences among science disciplines and reward programs and institutions that are doing little to contribute to the production of new teachers in key shortage subjects, such as Physical Science in 2019–2020. Further, there is no differentiation in the scoring for this metric that accounts for programs that produce significantly greater numbers of new teachers or the percentage increase relative to overall program size. Including such a differentiation

might encourage programs to increase their efforts to produce new teachers in these critical shortage areas. Only eight programs receiving the bonus this year increased their teacher production by more than ten teachers; ten produced just one more teacher than the previous year. Moving forward, the Department will consider this finding as it works to amend Rule 6A.5-066, F.A.C., and develops the corresponding business rules for the new Workforce Contribution metric established through SB 2524. This metric will include placement of program completers with additional weight given to production of completers in statewide critical teacher shortage areas.

FINDING

Eleven out of the 40 programs (28%) that earned the critical shortage area bonus received low scores for teacher placement.

Eleven of the programs that received the critical teacher shortage area bonus received a score of 2.0 or lower on the teacher placement metric, which means the employment rate of their new teachers is in the bottom third of similar programs in the state.

The critical teacher shortage area bonus is currently not applicable to EPIs and PDCPs. Because those programs by design may include teachers of varying grades and subjects, a separate set of business rules may be needed to determine their eligibility and production of teachers in shortage areas. The Department plans to address this recommendation along with the other revisions to the Annual Program Performance Report metrics as outlined in SB 2524.

CONSIDERATIONS

Florida's current teacher preparation accountability system is in need of changes and should be modernized to meet the needs of schools and Florida's PreK-12 students and families. This section of the report offers suggestions for the Department's consideration to further advance the architecture of its teacher preparation program accountability system and the value and usefulness of the information it provides with the goal of improving the quality of teacher preparation to improve outcomes for Florida's PreK-12 students. It should be read in conjunction with considerations provided in the 2021 version of this report as well as the findings and recommendations in the January 2022 teacher preparation audit report. The Department should continue to act with urgency in responding to these considerations, particularly as they pertain to how the Annual Program Performance Report (APPR) is calculated, used, and understood to improve teacher quality and, in turn, student academic outcomes in literacy and math. Many of the considerations below will be addressed by a workgroup following the same rigorous process used by the Department to improve other areas such as the development of standards. Moreover, some of the recommendations can be immediately reviewed by the Department and may be in place prior to the publication of the 2023 Florida Teacher Preparation Program Report.

1. Increase the number of programs that can be ranked by addressing the causes of unscored metrics and reevaluating the number of subscores required.

This report only includes rankings for 106 out of 320 teacher preparation programs. While the number of ranked programs increased in 2021 with the availability of student learning data for EPIs and PDCPs, the total number of ranked programs is limited by the important and necessary requirement that programs have student learning data to be ranked.

It is recommended the Department consider allowing programs for which a VAM score is not available to be ranked with only three subscores, giving additional weight to the teacher evaluation metric as an alternate measure of student learning for those programs. The Department will review and ensure any changes to this business rule maintain the validity and reliability of the ratings, prior to the publication of the 2023 Florida Teacher Preparation Program Report.

Additionally, the 2022 rankings continue to support past recommendations that the Department consider identifying and addressing the causes of why large numbers of programs are not scored. This was also a finding in the 2022 teacher preparation audit report. Seventy-three programs in this year's analysis have zero subscores. When performance data are missing for particular programs, the Department might consider including an explanation in

its public reporting, so that it is clear if the cause is an expected exclusion or something else that needs to be corrected or addressed. For example, a straightforward designation could be used to indicate whether programs are not rated because they are too small, had another legitimate reason for exclusion, or failed to meet minimum requirements.

2. Implement alternative weighting formulas based on evaluation data quality, rigorousness, and differentiation between programs.

All performance metrics continue to be treated equally in the calculation of summative scores even though some indicators may provide higher quality information than others and some clearly provide more differentiation among programs than others. Furthermore, the metrics are not consistent in their determination of program quality. This is also a finding shared by the 2022 audit report. For instance, while the retention rate rubric appears to be quite rigorous, requiring a minimum average retention rate of 3 years to earn a score of 3.0, the student learning subgroup measure only requires teachers to have positive learning results with 50% of the student subgroups to earn a 3.0 on the student learning subgroup measure. As noted in previous reports, the Department may want to consider whether these metrics should be equally weighted in the summative scores. Certain metrics are more useful to gauge program quality or inform policy improvement than others. SB 2524 and the revision to the teacher preparation rule in spring of 2023 will address these recommendations, as the revised metrics will better reflect the measurement of program quality.

Furthermore, there are programs that will never have certain metrics, such as those requiring student assessments. The differentiation in program ratings on this metric might be important

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
for identifying outliers, especially for programs for which there are no other metrics that reflect the performance in the classroom of program completers and their students.


When considering new weights and or metrics, it is important for the Department to run multiple simulations based on available data to determine impact ahead of time and identify potential implementation challenges.

As discussed earlier, further exploration of certain metrics through available data might provide helpful information to Florida teacher preparation programs and the field nationally, even if these data are not used for accountability purposes. For example, while there has been a slight downturn on the retention metric in 2021, the continuing relatively high level of performance on the teacher retention metric suggests that further analysis is warranted on whether new teachers continue to be employed in the same positions or change positions within or across schools or districts over their first five years of employment. Understanding what some programs may do that contributes to new teachers thriving in a variety of settings or in helping teacher candidates to identify which environments that suit them best could provide a substantial contribution to the field on an issue that continues to be a priority for Florida.



Placement Rate






Student Learning Growth

3. Align the application of the critical shortage area bonus metric to ensure it is meeting the objective of incentivizing and rewarding the production of the most needed teachers, while also aligning with the supply versus demand approach of the 2021 REACH Act, and further aligning with how districts and schools are truly recruiting, hiring, and retaining teachers with in-demand competencies.

The critical teacher shortage area metric is awarded only as a bonus so that it can only raise a program's overall score, as it is the state's intention to reward programs that produce teachers in shortage areas and not to penalize programs that do not. While this is a sound approach, the metric as presently applied does not actually reward those Florida programs that produce the most critically needed teachers. To earn the bonus, programs must show an increase in the number of teachers produced compared to the previous year. However, as currently defined, programs need only increase the number of teachers produced in critical shortage areas by one over the previous year, which does little to help the state's shortage issues. For both 2021 and 2022, many recipients of the bonus show very modest increases. In 2022, 83% of the bonus recipients produced fewer than 10 additional teachers. Meanwhile, programs that are graduating many more teachers in critical shortage areas but have not increased their numbers from the previous year do not earn the bonus. To solve this issue, the Department may want to consider developing a rubric for this metric similar to those of the other metrics that allows for a range of points to be earned so that both overall production and increase in production can be rewarded more meaningfully.

During the 2022 legislative session, Florida adopted new program continued approval metrics that recognize in-state placements weighted by critical teacher shortage areas. This Workforce Contribution metric was also proposed in the 2022 audit report; however, as a new APPR metric. To address this issue, the Department is convening a workgroup to further develop these new metrics and provide recommendations that will be reviewed by senior leadership at the Department and the State Board of Education in the spring of 2023.

4. Modify teacher preparation program accountability system business rules to make the resulting data more meaningful, elevate and replicate best practice programs, and correct low-performing programs.

Several changes might be made to the business rules used in calculating some of the metrics that would strengthen the reliability and usefulness of the data. First, while the system is designed to rate and rank providers at the program rather than institutional level, the practice of aggregating discrete programs so that programs with smaller numbers of completers can be included negates this program level accountability for the aggregated programs. In 2022, 124 of 399 programs, or 31%, are aggregates of multiple programs. While it may not be feasible to do away with all aggregations, the Department should consider developing a very narrow set of

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criteria under which aggregations are permissible. While some combining may be necessary to maintain the anonymity of program completers in very small programs, the Department should consider adopting a reasonable minimum n size to apply for making these determinations that provides the proper balance between protecting candidate anonymity and providing public accountability.

Second, rounding summative scores to the hundredths rather than the tenths place would allow for more illustrative comparisons. With only a 4-point scale, rounding to a single decimal place masks potentially meaningful differentiation between programs. It is likely there would be far fewer ties in the ranking tables if an additional decimal place was presented. It is also likely that in some cases rounding to only the tenths place nullifies the impact of the critical teacher shortage area bonus metric. The Department will review business rules and run simulations to determine the impact on APPR scores for programs. These simulations will help determine the best calculations to drive program improvements.

5. Develop and disseminate model surveys with a set of required items for all programs to meet the new accountability requirement, facilitate implementation, and maximize comparability across programs.

Satisfaction surveys of program completers and their employers were carried out for the first time during the 2020–2021 school year, with programs submitting their survey templates, completed forms, and summary findings to the state. The Department should consider tracking trends in response rates and survey content, independent of their forthcoming recommendations to the state board about how survey results should be incorporated in the continued program approval process and formula. The 2022 teacher preparation audit report recommends employer surveys and completer surveys to be included into the APPR calculation. Surveys should be designed by the Department's research and evaluation team (or a reputable third party) to ensure that the survey instruments are strongly linked to standards of practice. Furthermore, these surveys should include a majority of Department-generated standard items (e.g., 15) and a minimum number of program-provided items (e.g., 5). For scoring, the Department should consider creating scoring bands that combine response rates with favorability scores to ensure that programs meet the minimum sample size requirements to score this metric. The Department will review this recommendation and may begin the development of model surveys. These surveys may provide even more valuable and consistent information that programs can utilize to improve their quality.

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6. Continue to develop a dissemination strategy that ensures these findings reach the intended audiences, including the SBOE's strategy of the last two years to continually marry the findings of this report with the presentation of the annual critical shortage report, and any ongoing initiatives of the Governor, SBOE and Legislature (e.g., the Governor and Department's forthcoming development of a teacher apprenticeship model).

Florida's commitment and dedication of resources to the development and implementation of its teacher preparation program accountability system are commendable. A strategy, however, is needed to increase the APPR score visibility beyond the specific delivery requirements of the authorizing statute to maximize the reach and impact of the findings. The Department may want to consider public announcements and awards for progress to increase awareness of these scores and to better inform stakeholders, especially consumers of these programs including districts and prospective teachers, about the quality of individual programs and institutions. Additionally, requiring programs and institutions to post their APPR on their website or link to the results on the Department's website would also support increased visibility and awareness of the ratings. Following the adoption of an amended rule regarding teacher preparation, the Department will collaborate with communications, the Florida College System, the Board of Governors, Florida school districts and other stakeholders to ensure that new information is regularly shared.

Conclusion

The Department is committed to working alongside parents, community members and education stakeholders to provide a world-class education for students. Florida continues to be a leader in holding teacher preparation programs accountable for the outcomes of their program candidates while providing consistent support and technical assistance. Ensuring that these programs are of high quality is critical so that Florida's teacher workforce is prepared to meet the needs of all of Florida's students.

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FLORIDA TEACHER CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS

Teacher candidates in Florida are required to pass assessments that measure their competency in general knowledge, professional knowledge, and content area knowledge as a condition of certification. The rigor of the Florida Teacher Certification Examinations (FTCE) assures the preparedness of teacher preparation candidates to meet the needs of today's high-performing classrooms. The purpose of the FTCE program is to provide the state of Florida with an assessment tool that allows prospective educators to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in the areas of general knowledge, professional education competence (pedagogy), and subject area knowledge. The tests measure prospective teachers' achievement of the benchmarks established by the State Board of Education as stated in Rule 6A-4.0021, F.A.C., and published in the Competencies and Skills Required for Teacher Certification in Florida. Program completers' success in passing these assessments is an additional variable that helps shine a light on the quality of preparation provided by programs and the effectiveness of the teachers they produce.

Exhibit 58 lists the full set of assessments offered as part of the FTCE. Appendix H provides complete data for the assessments in wider use, including the program subject areas ranked in this report. For each teacher preparation program, first attempt and best attempt pass rates, number of examinees, and mean score are reported for each offered assessment. In addition, aggregate results for examinees who are not affiliated with particular preparation programs are reported.

There is a significant volume of available FTCE data, a comprehensive analysis of which is outside the scope of this report. Instead, the following section focuses on the FTCE Elementary Education subtests.

Before considering those data, there are some general observations and related suggestions that apply to most FTCE data. Florida reports pass rates for both first-time test takers and best attempt (i.e., the percentage of test takers who ultimately pass). The Department may want to consider also including the average number of attempts, which would provide important context for the best attempt data. The first-time pass rate provides some of this context, but the average number of attempts would provide even more.

Given the nature of the scope and scale of Florida's teaching licensure testing programs, these data should be examined closely given that the number of examinees not affiliated with a particular program may exceed the number of examinees from preparation programs, and in most cases, the pass rate for non-program examinees is considerably lower. The data is presented in a way that allows constituents the clarity needed to fully understand the potential relationship between pass rates and high-quality professional preparation. While it may be desirable for the state to have pathways that allow those who can demonstrate their subject area expertise to have a fast track to the classroom, especially in shortage areas, there may be unintended consequences associated with making the assessments so widely available. In particular, the large number of non-program examinees makes the average pass rate for a specific assessment not especially meaningful without looking at the breakdown between program and non-program test takers. A low average pass rate could result in the perception that a particular assessment is too difficult or the cut score too rigorous, when a closer look at the data tells a different story. It may also be helpful to take a closer look at the non-program examinees. It is possible that a percentage of these test takers are licensed teachers seeking to add a certification or endorsement in another subject area, and the pass rate for non-program examinees may be even lower if already certified teachers were removed from that group.

In addition, pass rate data for the professional knowledge and general knowledge examinations are only reported at the institutional level. There may be significant differences in passing rates across programs that cannot currently be ascertained. Further, it precludes any analysis across assessments for specific programs. It is not currently possible to see if there are programs that are stronger in content preparation but have considerable weaknesses in pedagogy, or vice

versa; either case would be important to know for programs' continuous improvement and potentially of interest to prospective teachers, hiring school districts, and policymakers as well. The Department might consider breaking these data out in the future.

Elementary Education

The FTCE in Elementary Education includes four subtests: Language Arts and Reading, Social Science, Science, and Mathematics. Exhibit 59 shows the elementary education programs with 100% pass rates for either the first or best attempt, along with the corresponding 2022 APPR score and corresponding program rank in this year's report. No state university programs had subtests with 100% first attempt and/or best attempt past rates.

It should be noted that although the FTCE and APPR data used in this year's report are from roughly the same timeframe, there may be variance in program cohorts and the comparison between pass rates and APPRs is provided for informational purposes only. In addition, the number of test takers varies across programs from the single digits to over 900, and it may be less challenging for a small program to achieve a perfect pass rate.




Looking at performance on each of the subtests, the social science subtest has the highest pass rate for first-time test takers, with 67% passing the first time, as well as the highest overall pass rate, with 81% of examinees ultimately passing.

Elementary Education Subtests: First Attempt and Best Attempt Pass Rates




However, as noted above, looking at pass rates without distinguishing between program and non-program examinees may mask important differences. Exhibit 61 shows the results for each subtest comparing these two groups of examinees. As noted above, non-program examinees have considerably lower pass rates than program examinees; the gap is even wider for best attempt pass rates. It would be particularly interesting to identify the number of attempts non-program examinees are making, given that considerable resources are expended on unsuccessful attempts. There may be additional information that could be provided by the Department to help potential examinees who are not enrolled in preparation programs to determine whether they are ready to take the assessment.



Elementary Education Subtests: First and Best Attempt Pass Rates for Program and Non-Program Examinees



APPENDIX D—AGGREGATIONS

Florida's teacher preparation accountability system is designed to evaluate program-level, rather than institutional-level performance. Although the state aims for program-level accountability, it does combine together data from certain programs to increase the amount of available data. For example, in certain cases graduate and undergraduate programs are combined, discrete science programs such as biology, chemistry, or physics are combined, and discrete world language programs (e.g., French or Spanish) are combined.

The following programs are identified by the Department with the same program code for the purposes of producing the APPR and thus were considered as a single program in the analyses in this report.
