Set a timer for 1 minute for students to read as “WELL” as they can. Have them put a “STOP DOT” at the last word they read and count the words. You can count the words in each line to the right side in your teacher book and chart your student’s RATE! This is a good practice to do at least 2-3 times a month! 😊</p>
