<p>Monday, January 24th</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Galactic Pastries with Families <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Parents will enjoy breakfast pastries and read AR books in the media center from 7:45 – 8:30 a.m. • FSU athletes visiting campus as guest readers • -What in the World? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students will participate in some vocabulary themed activities to increase knowledge of the world around them
<p>Tuesday, January 25th</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take a Flight to Mexico: Dress in colors Red, Green, Yellow and Brown <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Teachers and students read the books, <i>Anita and the Dragons</i> and <i>What Can you do with a Rebozo</i> and then complete a writing activity • Techie Tuesday <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Classes will read books focusing on technology. As a class (primary) or independently (intermediate) students will create a PowerPoint, YouTube video, or some other technological review of the book that they will send/share with another class on campus.
<p>Wednesday, January 26th</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Out of this World Wednesday <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dress in space themes: astronaut, planets, alien, etc. Students will watch the video “What is it like to live on the international space station?” and respond to the following prompt: Write or (draw in K/1) what do you think would be the best part of living on the international space station? Turn finished projects in and reading coach will select a few to be shared on the morning news! • Where in the World <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Classes will design informational posters/banners that display assigned content

**Thursday,
January 27th**

- Time Travel – students at each grade level will read specific books from specific periods in history and compare their findings
- Blast off Hats Off!
 - Wear your favorite hat to school. Teachers will read aloud a science-based literature book and complete a rocket graphic organizer. Teachers will allow students to be creative in decorating their rockets
- Destination Literacy
 - Family Literacy Night from 5:30 – 7:30 PM in the cafeteria
 - Families will learn about literacy strategies they can use with their children at home, create an at home literacy station and listen to guest readers

**Friday,
January 28th**

- Fantastic Voyage Friday
- Literacy activity stations will be set up in all core classrooms. Classes will take a voyage around campus visiting different stations
- I need Some Space
 - Students will focus on conventions in writing (such as spacing) with some fun, space themed prompts.
- Blast into the Future: Aliens and UFO's, Oh My!
 - Dress Up: Wear your favorite space t-shirt or dress up as a space character or alien (think *Star Wars*) or an astronaut
 - Suggested Book(s) of the Day – *Aliens in Underpants Save the World* by Claire Freedman & Ben Cort, *The Darkest Dark* by Chris Hadfield, *Rocket says, "Look up"* by Nathan Byron, or teachers will select another space themed book from Story time from Space.com
 - Family Movie Night Under the Stars: outdoor movie night for families to watch Disney's *Space Buddies* movie
