This report contains private school and student statistics for the September payment period of the 2009-2010 school year.





McKay Student Enrollment by Gender





McKay Student Enrollment by Grade Level





McKay Student Eligibility for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch





McKay Student Racial/Ethnic Enrollment








